I look across the edge, but when I hear the water rushing I step back.

Not daring to look again, but the sounds of nature lead me.

So I step forward to see.

It's like a big water slide, but like a fierce tiger.

It could fill an Olympic pool every second.

Froth fills the air like white smoke.

The sound of bombs surround me, but after one another over and over again.

It's boisterous but astonishing.

When would you think that so much water could just power down from the mountains.

Over and over again. I think how it would be like for your house to be crushed, just by water.

Rains and flooding have caused damage to homes, the need to evacuate homes and even suburbs across the state. Tomorrow we will present a cheque to Life Without Barriers, from our Mini Vinnie's group to support young people with serious disability.

Family, friends, shelter, love, health and an attitude of gratitude for all that we do have (and not what we haven't) are important, many other things we worry about are simply not!

Family Activity: Discuss different ways that you could give within the family, as a family or as individuals, so that when there are moments that you feel you want to give to others, the ideas will already be there.





WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity
- Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
