

From the Principal:

A letter was sent home via email yesterday to all families in relation to our Car Park in Margaret St. From today it is reopened for access by staff and parents. Students can be dropped off or collected from here as per the case before the redevelopment. Thank you to the parents who exercised patience and understanding across the last period of time, when the Car Park was out of action.

Yesterday as part of the letter we also shared new arrangements for the collecting of students at the end of the school day. Key points included were:

- Margaret Street car park will be open from Thursday 16th June before and after school to be used to
 collect students after school. Students catching buses from Launceston College and the Redline Bus are
 to go to this area, as was the case before the car park redevelopment started.
- Students waiting to be collected from York Street will now wait inside the gate closest to the P-2 building, not nearest the Office building. Teachers will be visible out on the footpath and direct students to cars once they have parked. This area was used previously for York Street collection before the P-2 building was redeveloped, several years ago. This will provide greater safety for our students and allow cars to park further up the street, allowing cars to move in and out more efficiently. This has been happening on Tuesday and Wednesday nights of this week already.
- Margaret Street and York Street will be the only two areas that students can be collected from.
 Students will not be able to wait for parents at the Bourke Street gates from this Thursday onwards.
- Only students catching a bus will be waiting, supervised by a staff member outside the Grade 3 classrooms.
- Bourke Street gate will not be open after school. Students with parents, once collected can walk out of the gates but there will be no access into the school from Bourke Street.
- Bourke Street gates at this stage will remain open to parent access before school as traffic issues are much reduced in the mornings compared to after school.
- Students will either be collected from their classroom by parents directly after school or they will make their way to either:
 - -York St inside the gates adjacent Prep Best.
 - -Margaret Street car park, returning to the same waiting and collection routines as before the redevelopment of the car park.

As a school we strongly encourage the use of Margaret Street for drop off and collection of students as the preferred option.

We understand that some parents may find this process frustrating initially, however we have made this decision around safety, improved traffic flow and supervision of students. We cannot continue to have our students waiting on the street on the footpath, with only several metres between them and vehicles, with no barrier or protection. This is why our students will be waiting inside the gates.

We are trialling this approach as it is very likely that once the building program starts for the refurbishment of our 3 /4 classrooms and conversion of our library into classrooms, early in 2017 that Bourke Street will be needed for builder parking and access. If we trial this next period of time not using Bourke Street, this transition will also be smoother for parents into next year.

A Boom Gate will be enabled in the entrance to the Church of the Apostles, shortly. For some time this area has been requested to not be used as parking. For the benefit of Fr. Mark and Fr. Anthony as well as people needing access in and out of this area, the boom gate will be used to control entry particularly before and after school each day.

I appreciate the support of parents in these changes, with the aim being improved traffic flow as well as increased safety and supervision of students after school.



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Hi parents and carers!

We're writing from Camp Quality to let you know that our Primary School Education program has been invited to perform at your child's school.

Camp Quality is Australia's most trusted children's charity. Our purpose is to create the best quality of life for kids living with cancer and their families. At no cost to schools, parents or students- our vivacious and loveable puppets, Kylie, Dean and Melissa visit schools to help support children affected by cancer. The puppets dispel myths and misconceptions that are commonly associated with the illness. Since 1988 our program has visited schools across Australia, sharing an interactive, engaging narrative that explains:

- The ins and outs of cancer
- Why their peer who has undergone treatment may look a little different (due to the side effects of chemotherapy)
- Why it's important to be supportive of their classmate who is either living with cancer or has a diagnosed parent or sibling
- That cancer isn't contagious, so it's ok to play
- The importance of positivity and recognising our own strengths

"It took away the stigma and fear from cancer. As we have a student at our school being treated for leukaemia, it helped the children understand what she is going through and why she has lost her hair. Having an understanding of the disease has certainly increased the empathy in the other children too." - Primary school principal

"The manner in which the show addresses cancer is age appropriate while clearly articulating the facts. It has helped me to be able to talk about cancer in a positive and reassuring manner"- Primary school teacher

Following the performance, students are encouraged to ask questions and share their concerns. While we are able to answer most of their questions and concerns, we provide teachers with resources to supplement the performance and aid classroom discussion. If any concerns arise after the performance, please feel free to contact us.
