HOLY WEEK

This week students from Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School join with millions of Christians around the world to celebrate Holy Week.

Holy Week, the final week of Lent, began on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. Holy Week commemorates the Passion of Christ, from His triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, when palm branches were placed in His path, through His arrest on Holy Thursday and Crucifixion on Good Friday, to Holy Saturday, the day that Christ's body lay in the tomb. Because the date of Palm Sunday depends on the date of Easter, the dates of Holy Week change every year.

Our focus, at Sacred Heart, has been to celebrate the Stations of the Cross.

The Stations tells the story of Jesus' final moments of life on earth.

Jesus died in Jerusalem. Jesus walked from the courtyard to Calvary Hill carrying His cross. Calvary is where He was crucified. The path he used is called Via Dolorosa, "the way of pain."

Since His death, people began to make visits to Jerusalem and walk in Jesus' footsteps. The people would walk on that same path, Via Dolorosa that Jesus used. They would stop along the way and would remember what happened to Jesus at the exact spot where they are standing.

Remember, Jesus was carrying His cross and the different things that happened to Him along the Via Dolorosa are called stations. That's how we got the name **Stations of the Cross**.

Just as Jesus has his cross to bear we are all challenged in the season of Holy Week to take up others cross. This Easter season take some time to be thankful for all of the wonderful things that you have in your life. Compare that to families in far less privileged countries that are consistently faced with war and famine.

When we are seeking for role models on how to lead our lives we need look no further than the example of Jesus Christ. Consider for a moment how he treated the poor, the lame, the downtrodden and the outcast. We should be proud that our school motto proclaims how we should live... "All for the Sacred Heart"

I wish you all a happy, safe and prayerful Easter season.

From the Principal:**GRADE 6 CAMPS**

In the last two weeks I have been privileged to attend the two Grade 6 camps.

I was genuinely proud of our Grade 6 classes on camp because of their respectful and positive attitudes. Whether it was walking into bush, and remembering to respect the environment around them and the people who were enjoying it, or being in a public space, or engaging in activities that challenged their mental and physical capabilities, each and every child "rose to the occasion". I received countless positive affirmations from our staff and camp facilitators that acknowledged the children and their actions. I know that each child had worked tirelessly to be positive and respectful people in the three days they had away. I also know that each one of those children has parents and teachers that have and continue to support them in reaching this point. We will continue to challenge our children to make improvements and to transfer the positive actions from camp to school to home.

In Tasmanian Catholic Primary Schools only half have maintained a camping program. Our school continues to offer camps from Grades 4-6. For some schools they chose to "drop camps" because OHS and WHS laws and paperwork have become "too much". Our school continues to maintain camps because we value the opportunities that they provide.

What are the benefits of attending camps?

- Opportunities to develop independence
- Chances to interact with a broad range of children
- Learning to take turns amongst a larger number of people
- Countless opportunities to try new things
- Challenges that don't exist in the four walls of a classroom
- Experiences with the environment
- Enjoying meal time with classmates
- Visit places that children haven't been to before
- Develop resilience when things don't go your way
- Children are required to problem solve

If you do the music program you will be invoiced in the next couple of weeks, \$530 per year with instrument or \$300 if you have your own.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.



Seasons for Growth Grief Program

Learning to live with change and loss

Our school has over recent years offered Rainbows as a program to support children dealing with Grief and Loss in their lives. Last year and this year we are working with CatholicCare and are able to offer a similar program called Seasons for Growth, where young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

We are pleased to be able to offer this important program and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those who attend.

The Seasons for Growth Program runs for eight weeks and each weekly session is 40 – 50 minutes. The program concludes with a 'Celebration' session. Later in the year each group will have the opportunity to meet for two further sessions to build on their learning.

**Our next sessions will be held for Grades 2, 3 and 4 students
and will begin in Term 2.**
