Reflections from Principal's Meetings at Tarraleah

All Tasmanian Catholic Principals along with Archbishop Julian Porteous and many Tasmanian Catholic Education (TCEO) staff gathered in Tarraleah for 2.5 days of meetings, dialogue, discussion and reflection. As a collective we gather 4 times a year. We were lead last week by Associate Professor William Sultmann. The theme of his presentation was centred around, "Leadership as Discipleship". Listening to the presentations and engaging in conversations with other Principals supported my understanding of the theme. We spent time reflecting on the person Jesus was. In particular we focussed on the life he lead and the life he wants for us all.

After School Pick Up and Parking - Update

Last week we shared our significant concerns regarding road safety and after school pick up. A parent who has been a member of our school community for almost a decade emailed me the following.

"I wanted to write you a quick email in regards to side gate (York Street) pick up issues. I have read this weeks newsletter and really hope that other parents read it and take notice too. I have been involved with the school now for over 10 years and the current situation is the worst that I have witnessed. Quite often the traffic is already blocked by parents waiting in line at 2.55pm which I find ridiculous as the children are not even out of class yet. There are a couple of nights of the week that I need to leave school straight away to get to after school activities. To allow for this I arrive at school early, park in the angle parking, walk into school to collect the children only to find that my car is blocked in because parents are unwilling to drive around the block. My inability to leave also impacts others ability to find vacant car parks. The traffic congestion continues down towards town York street direction and into Margaret St.

Whilst I can deal with these inconveniences I believe the situation is dangerous, stressful for some and I am surprised there has not been more accidents or unsafe incidents.

I am extremely grateful to the teachers for supervising the children and getting them to their parents cars as quickly as possible and I completely understand that they cannot and shouldn't need to add traffic controller to their job description.

Thanks for your efforts with this, I have my fingers crossed we see some improvement soon."

What is obvious from the email is that some parents are frustrated about the traffic. I suggest that this parent's thinking is consistent with many others. As indicated in the email it is up to everyone to make changes in behaviour if they are contrary to what our school requires, to support the safety of the children of SHS.

Some key messages for all of us to reflect on

- Every child's safety is important.
- Driving around the block is not as important as the safety of others.
- Am I breaking the law by double parking? Or overstaying in short term parking spots?
 Am I blocking others from getting out because I don't want to drive around the block?
- Picking up at 3.15pm is so much quieter and easier. Your children are safe with us.
- Safety is always our paramount concern before people's time commitments.

This week you may have been directed around the block by a Traffic Controller or Brent. Thanks to those who understood why we were very direct with our signals and accepted driving around the block is less important than the safety of our children.

I too am hopeful that people will have read last week's newsletter and this week's follow up in the spirit it is meant.

- Before School Care commences at 8am. Parents MUST speak to Mr Wilson if they need support prior to 8am.






Entertainment Books Fundraiser for 2018

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.


Hayme's Paint Hoo Hoo Hut - Fancy Dress Charity 5km


