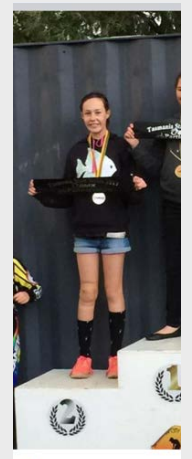


Cayley (Gr.6)& Jackson(Gr.1) Quill competed in the 4th and last round of the State BMX Series on Sunday.

Archbishop Robert William Willson

On Friday May 12th (evening) at 7pm all students and families are invited to attend the reinternment of Archbishop Robert William Willson (1794–1866) at St Mary's Cathedral, Hobart.

Please see below for information about Bishop Wilson.

- Born 11 December 1794, Lincoln, England
- Ordained to the priesthood 16 December 1824
- Appointed to the Catholic mission in Nottingham, February 1825
- Appointed to the See of Hobart Town in March 1842
- Ordained bishop in St Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham, 28 October 1842
- Arrived in Hobart on 11 May 1844
- Installed as bishop in St Joseph's Church, Hobart, 12 May 1844
- Departed Hobart on last visit to England, 27 February 1865
- Died in Nottingham, 30 June 1866
- Buried in St Barnabas' Cathedral, Nottingham, crypt, 5 July 1866
- Exhumed on 14 February 2017
- Mortal remains arrived back in Australia, 27 February 2017
- Re-interred in St Mary's Cathedral crypt, 12 May 2017
