IS "COMPASSION" A VERB OR A NOUN FOR US?"

Our society needs all sorts of people for it to function effectively. We all know that doctors, cleaners, farmers, plumbers, builders, teachers are just some of the occupations that are required to ensure we can all live effectively. Each one of these people has a job to do. It will always be important that these roles are fulfilled effectively.

Harmonious and compassionate societies need more than people fulfilling their job descriptions. They need people of compassion. Catholic Schools aspire to prepare our children for their future career. We also want to support families by providing and challenging children to be more than that. As a Catholic School it will always be our challenge to assist and support children to be better people. Our school supports, implements and encourages children to reflect the gospel values. But what does that really mean. Very simply we challenge children, and by extension the entire community of Sacred Heart, to live lives as Jesus did.

We can only ever expect children to understand what it means to be "gospel people" if they are provided with guidance, role models and opportunity.

Almost 30 years ago a "program" was initiated in our Tasmanian Catholic Primary Schools. The program has extended to be a way of life. Referred to as MJR (Making Jesus Real), it is an opportunity for children to grow closer to Christ. It is one of the ways we work with children to help them understand the connection between their lives and the way Jesus lived.

All of our children spend time reflecting on their own lives through MJR. They share stories, engage in discussion, view "film clips" and ultimately reflected on what type of person they are. Later this year each Grade 6 child will be asked to consider, "How do you want to be remembered when you leave this school?" Questions like these are very much meant to inspire children "not to want more, but to be more…"

MJR is a "language of opportunity" that has been "crafted" to be lived by the participant. When children, and by extension our community, up take the opportunity by living out the "gospel values" then we are truly a disciple of Christ.
