2018 THE YEAR OF YOUTH

"An old man said, 'Erasers are made for those who make mistakes.' A youth replied, 'Erasers are made for those who are willing to correct their mistakes'."

The Australian Bishops have identified the liturgical year of 2018 as a national Year of Youth (beginning on the first Sunday of Advent in 2017).

The Year of Youth invites the Church into prayerful discernment about the importance and life-giving presence of young people in the local Church and society. It calls for dialogue and active engagement focused on the reconnection and renewal of a new generation of young people in the life of the Church.

In recent weeks I have reflected on a few occasions and conversations that has affirmed my thoughts about your children and the wider community of young people. On occasions we hear of stories of young people acting irresponsibly. I reflect on my own youth and know that I made mistakes of which I'm not particularly proud. At different points in our lives we all do things that we shouldn't have.

The conversations and my reflections affirmed my thoughts of what we can expect for the future. If I compare the youth of today to the youth of my era I can confidently suggest that our modern youth

- Are far more respectful of the environment
- Show genuine care and concern for the elderly
- Have an exceptional understanding and promotion of social justice matters
- · Are able to speak confidently in front of large numbers of people
- Have great respect for "people with differences"

Each one of these items will mean that our future society will be better than our current. In the past few weeks I have witnessed living examples of the aforementioned items. They include

- Two of our children raising money for "The Make a Wish Foundation" (exceptional givers Tim and Stuart)
- The way our Grade 5 class listened and enacted upon advice from camp instructors
- Watching children tidy and beautify our school and local community environment
- On a daily basis visiting classrooms where our children need to collaborate, tolerate and work with a children of all types of needs.

We can foster thinking so children become agents of change. If we promote intolerance, racial hatred and a disdain for the environment then we can expect our children will copy our offerings. What I admire in your children is that when free thinking children are provided with the appropriate gospel values they will make what Pope Francis talks about "choosing to make the right decisions".

I have great faith that tomorrow's world will be an even better place than our current one because your children will control the destiny of thoughts and actions. The next time you hear and see people who are "running down" our youth remind them of the wonderful actions that they are fulfilling.

STUDENT SAFETY

We take every child's safety seriously. Last year we made a few changes to provide a safer environment for children.

To support your child's safety parents/grandparents are required to:

- Parents who come to school during school hours must access our school via the York Street entrance.
- Our gates in all other spaces will be locked at 9.00am and opened again at 3.00pm.

(Please note: last weeks newsletter incorrectly said 9.15am lock up)

- For some families this will be an inconvenience. Please understand the purpose of our change is to not to make things awkward but rather to provide safer processes for the children of Sacred Heart.
- Equally we need your help, sometimes the gates are left open. We know this is not deliberate but it is everyone's responsibility to close the gates if they have been left open.
- We will also be discussing this with your children so they too can close gates if they see them open, and also ask children to inform an adult if they see an open gate.
- Families will notice stop signs on the gates to remind parents and children to close the gates.
- If your child is picked up by others please ensure they read this information or at least you pass it on.

Schedule Of Fees for 2018

A payment plan was attached to your account. This form must be completed by all families even if payment plan is in place (just mark this on form).

No sibling discount has been given at this stage for any students at other Catholic schools. We will apply this discount once the payment plan form is returned and completed with these details.

If you do the music program you will be invoiced in the next couple of weeks, \$530 per year with instrument or \$300 if you have your own.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered.

It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.
