CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK

This week is Catholic Education Week.

It is timely to reflect on our 38 schools. We educate over 15,000 children with more than 2,500 employees. John Mula, Executive Director of Catholic Education Tasmania, commented this week "The proud reputation Catholic schools enjoy today is based on the strong tradition built by parishes and religious orders who founded Catholic education in Tasmania. Our schools continue to aspire to the same distinctive mission and ideals of maintaining high academic standards within a faith-based education framework."

Historically most of our schools, including Sacred Heart, were established by hard working parishioners and members of religious orders. Schools that are built today rely predominantly on government funding. When our school was built 146 years ago governments provided no financial support. When we reflect on the past custodians of Sacred Heart and the legacy they left we have much to be thankful for.

In our celebrations this week Grade 6 Davie represented our school at Mass. On Wednesday afternoon at the Tasmanian Catholic Education Commission (TCEC) Award Ceremony Kelly Cox was presented with an award for "Outstanding Contribution as a Friend in Catholic Schools". Kelly has been an active member of our parent community for more than 10 years. Her contributions include her role as Parents and Friends President, Fair Coordinator, Uniform Manageress, parent help and volunteer extraordinaire.

The following comments were made about Kelly on Wednesday afternoon... "Kelly's commitment, energy and drive have been integral to the success of the school fair, raising funds to improve school facilities... Kelly has a positive and friendly attitude. She has the ability to positively influence others and encouragement and support other parents to support the school."

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered.

It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
