From the Principal Assessment at Sacred Heart

"I care more about the people my students become than the scores on the tests they take." (Anonymous)

This week our Grade 3 and 5 children participated in National Testing along with children across Australia in Years 3,5,7 and 9. Our children completed assessments in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy.

These tests are "one-off snapshots" of your child's academic progress in core subjects that provide parents and our school with information. Teachers use the data to consider the strengths and challenges of students. In particular we use it to reflect on progress.



Assessment at Sacred Heart ... continued



Parents are reminded that teachers are constantly assessing students with a broad range of assessment tasks in all classrooms. Our ongoing assessments are NOT “one off”. They provide a more detailed picture of your child.

When NAPLAN data is returned later this year remember to consider the results along with the conversations that teachers share with you about all of the assessment tasks. At ANYTIME parents are encouraged to speak/meet with teachers to seek feedback about your child's progress.

One of my observations about the teachers of today and in particular of the teachers of Sacred Heart is they are very aware of children and their needs. They spend incredible amounts of time and energy collecting, interpreting and making conclusions about your child. I'm am genuinely proud to lead a school that has teachers that know the needs of the children they teach. Just as importantly they are always questioning themselves and one another how they can improve as teachers to support the children they work with.

Finally remember that NAPLAN doesn't assess what type of global citizen your child is, it doesn't provide feedback on your child's capacity to collaborate, it won't give you information on empathy, emotional and mental well-being, work-habits, manners, kindness and effort. Each one of us understands that for your child to progress in our society these qualities are critical. NAPLAN should always be considered as one aspect of your child's academic progress. Catholic Schools will always seek to provide a holistic education.

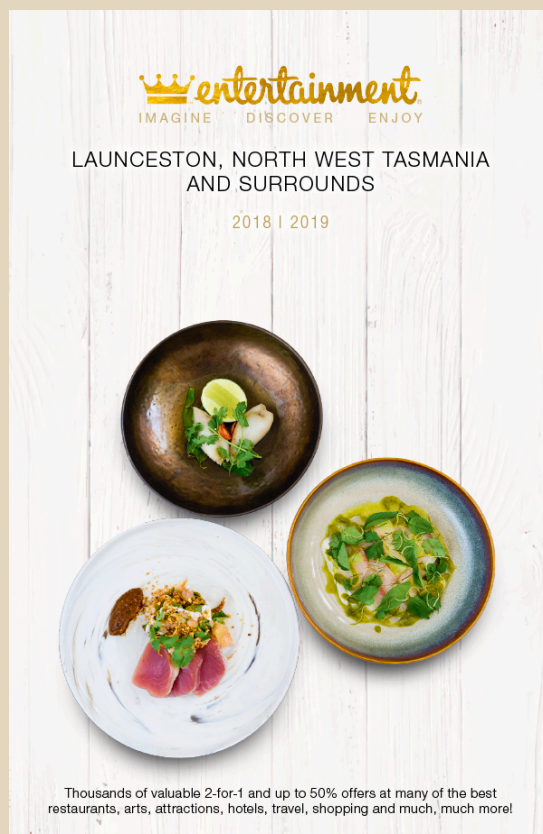

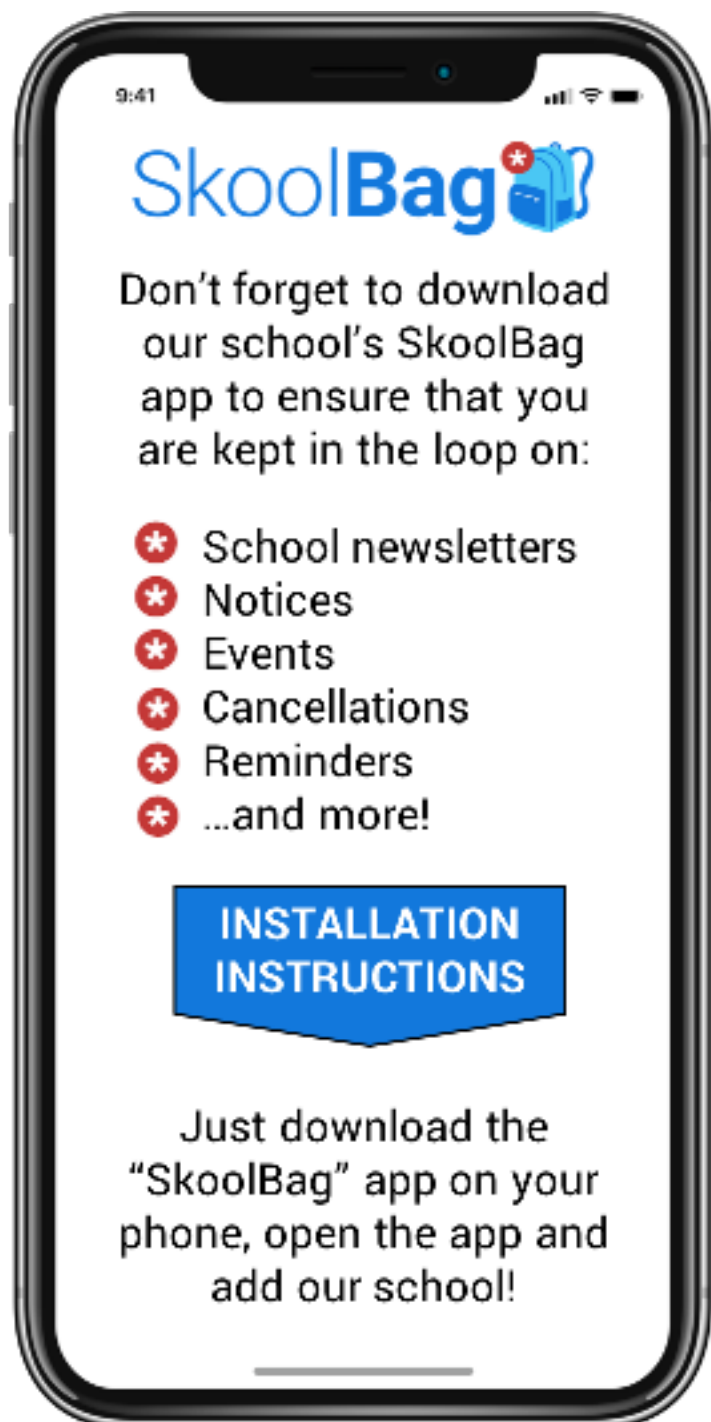

Our school app is very useful for notifying the school when your child is sick and great for viewing the newsletter. It is also handy for receiving last minute notifications (eg, event cancellations)

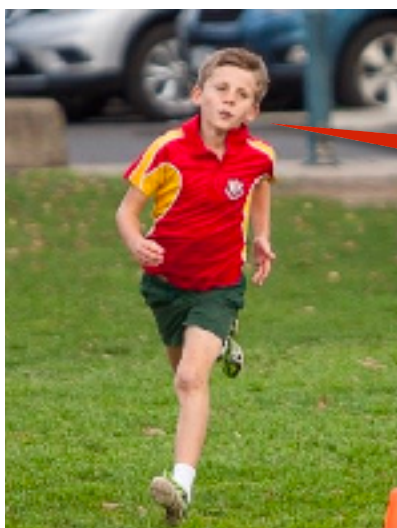

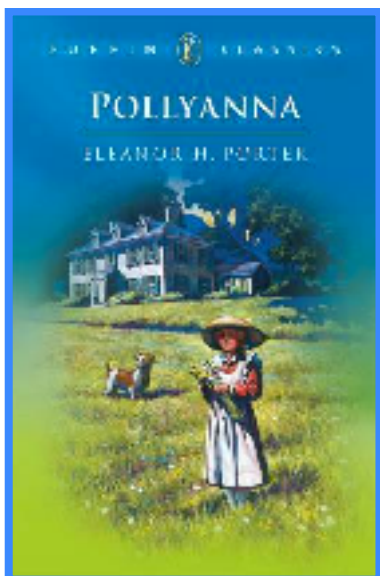

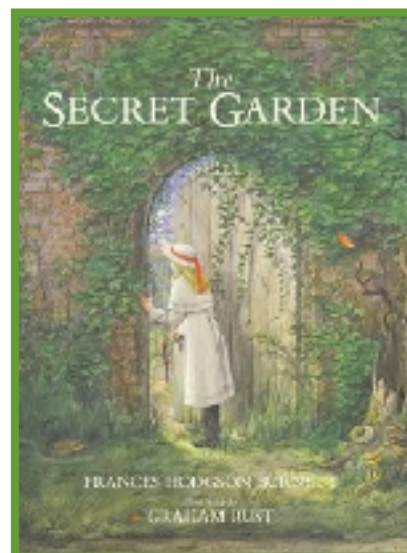

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Please note that children arriving late to school need to enter the school via the York St entrance and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.
