## From the Principal

### The Gift of the Sacred Heart.....Sacred Heart Feast Day

“ Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong. Let all that  
you do be done with love.” (Corinthians 16:13-14)

Last Friday was the Feast of the Sacred Heart. On this day we  
celebrate as a school. For 145 years we have gathered as a  
community to celebrate our school. It is an opportunity to  
remember all those who have come before us and all those that  
make up SHS today.

As a Catholic School our very foundations are built upon being  
a Catholic School. Put simply if there was no Catholic in Sacred  
Heart Catholic Primary School then our school would not exist.  
We also take great pride in being an inclusive school,  
welcoming families from all faiths and backgrounds.

On Friday last Fr Mark, in his homily, spoke about the gift of the  
Sacred Heart. He made connections with our own gifts, the  
talents that each member of our school community has.

As a school community we celebrate our gifts in so many varied  
ways. As a school community we are challenged to look and  
celebrate the gifts of one another. There are times in all of our  
lives that we struggle seeing our own gifts and indeed  
identifying the gifts of others, in these times we are called to  
look even more closely as we were all created in the image of  
Christ.

While our two formal Parent/Teachers are structured on these dates, we remind parents if you have any questions, queries or concerns throughout the year, we welcome informal conversations on student progress in providing the best educational outcomes for each child.

## Playground Update

Plans are currently being drawn up by our Playground Master Planner, Playstreet. These will be shared with our community in the near future. Members of the Playground Team have viewed the concept drawings and are excited by the drawings, they match the key requests identified by our community.

At our most recent Parents and Friends meeting the P and F agreed to increase the grant provided from P and F funds to \$90,000 in 2018. This means that in 2018 there will be no classroom grants, as teachers have agreed to forgo these, to enable a more significant figure for the benefit of an improved playspace.

As a school we are matching the \$90,000. Our current planning is working towards the first stage of construction being in the Third Term holidays allowing for children to enjoy the new playspace in Term 4.


The children of SHS thank the P and F and indeed all parents for your very significant support of the playground.







## WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

**If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event.** This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

### How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form [www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\\_with\\_children](http://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children)
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

**Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.**

## Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.
