The idea of saying sorry with sincerity is worth understanding. What does it mean to be sorry? Is it just saying you are sorry and then moving on forgetting about what has just happened? Is it saying sorry with the shared understanding that there is a commitment in these words to work harder than before to not do the thing we have just done. To learn from our previous mistake.

I often feel that when we talk about our School community for some of us we only think of the students. The greatest teaching our students get is not in the words they hear but in the behaviours they see. In particular the behaviours they see from the important adults in their lives in school and outside.

"Do as I say not do as I do." - is a mantra many of us heard from our parents and perhaps our children have heard from us. If we honestly believe the responsibility to teach our children resides with everyone else (that is, home or school depending on which you reside) then our children will more than likely not reach the potential they have and deserve to reach.

If we make mistakes as teachers and staff we should name them. We should apologise without reservation.

If we make mistakes as parents we should name them and apologise without reservation, whether that is to another parent, student, teacher or staff member.

If we let pride get in the way of doing what is right, then our children learn to let pride get in the way.



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered.

It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.

- If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
