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From the Principal:

"World Day of Migrants and Refugees"

You can get everything in life you want if you will just help enough other people get what they want..."

Last Sunday was World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Australia is made up of millions of people who were either born here or their ancestry includes family members who were born overseas. Our country is indebted to the people who bring their talents to our shores to make our country an even richer country.

Fr Mark reminded us on the weekend that "we are challenged by Pope Francis to be part of the welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating of migrants and refugees here in our own community. Sunday was a reminder of the need to examine our attitudes and to seek the grace we need to our sisters and brothers who come from such complex and difficult situations to live among us in this our land of great blessing. In the words of Pope Francis: Every strange who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age. (Matthew 25:35 - 43)"

Why do I remind our community of this event?

It is important we look at issues such as these with an open mind. Ask yourself how would Jesus have responded when migrants and refugees landed on our shores? None of us need reminding of the millions who have escaped countries like "war-torn" Syria in the past 5 years. None of us can possibly understand the sheer helplessness that must have been faced by these people. In a country as fortunate as ours we can't possibly imagine what it is like to face the challenges that refugees have faced unless we too are refugees.

There are thousands of examples of migrants and refugees who have 'value-added' to Australia. For the food lovers alone, I'm sure we all acknowledge that variety of culinary opportunities that have 'hit our shores' since the introduction of these cultures has value added to our palettes. Equally migrants and refugees bring so many other qualities to our country, let's all remember, "that they actually add to our culture".

Seasons for Growth Grief Program

Learning to live with change and loss

Our school has over recent years offered Rainbows as a program to support children dealing with Grief and Loss in their lives. Last year and this year we are working with CatholicCare and are able to offer a similar program called Seasons for Growth, where young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

We are pleased to be able to offer this important program and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those who attend.

The Seasons for Growth Program runs for eight weeks and each weekly session is 40 – 50 minutes. The program concludes with a 'Celebration' session.

Our next sessions will be held for Grades 5 and 6 students

and will begin in late this term on 14th September.

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Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- •email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- ·use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.
- Students are not to arrive before 8am
- If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Reminder that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds without prior permission from the Principal

TOILET ACCESS AFTER HOURS

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.
