From the Principal:

One of the passions I have in life is watching sport. Each week I find myself critiquing the players, umpires and coaches for their performances. The same applies for whatever sport I watch. Aside from the fact I never achieved any great heights playing sport, I really have no idea what each one of these individuals puts into the preparation, planning and playing of their sport. I suspect I am like many other ‘sports watchers’.

Why is it then that every week many of us pretend to be armchair experts? I suspect the huge media attention on games such as AFL provides us with the idea that we should have an opinion on what is playing out before our eyes. There is nothing wrong with having an opinion as long as we remember opinions don’t make any of us an expert or indeed factually accurate.

We all know there are two sides to many stories and in fact there are more often than not more than two sides to the story. Not one of us has witnessed the countless hours that sportsmen and women pour into refining their craft, unless we too are elite athletes. If we all think more deeply about the events then it doesn’t take a ‘rocket scientist’ to realise that each and every athlete is already a winner by simply making the highest level of sport. Just as there can only ever be one gold medallist in every event there must be “multiple athletes” who don’t win. What do the stories of sport have to do with life at Sacred Heart?

Each and every week there are many messages we can apply to daily living at our Catholic school. These include...

In a school where there over 460 students, almost 50 staff and more than 900 parents working and living side by side it stands to reason we won't always agree on who performs the “triple somersault pike” best just as we won't always agree on why things happen as they do in schools. A powerful message for all of us to remember, to ‘forgive is to be healed’. There are times that we too need to take time to reflect on whether we forgive all those who do things to us or our children or do we continue to bring up the past?

Look deep into the souls of the children, staff and parents of our school community and admire the fact that each and every one of us was created in God's image. Each one of us has much to contribute. Each one of us is challenged to support one another in the other's quest to be a better person. Each one of us is a gift from God.

Grade 6 Trevallyn Power Station

Our grade 6 classes walked to Trevallyn power station to learn more about how power is generated and used in parts of Tasmania. We learnt about the history of hydropower in Tasmania, where and how the water is dammed and which parts are in the generator. We also got a tour of the power station and how the power is generated by water. We toured around by the wonderful people who work in the power station. We saw the water flush through the tunnel and spins the turbine which spins the magnet and creates magnetic energy which can be transferred into usable energy which is sent out to thousands of homes in Tasmania. In general it was a really fun day and a great experience.







Reminder on procedures for Student absences, late arrivals and signing out

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher



It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

-You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.

-Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

Bourke/Margaret street gates:

- opened by 8:00am
- locked at 9.00am (approximately)
- unlocked at 3:00 pm by duty teacher
- locked at approximately 3:30 pm by duty teacher

York St gate:

- unlocked prior to 8:00 am
- only access point during the day

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Reminder that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds without prior permission from the Principal

TOILET ACCESS AFTER HOURS

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.
