We can inspire others by

- **Being a good example** (People watch what you do more than they listen to what you say. Be someone worth emulating)
- **Caring about others** (People don't care about how much you know until they know how much you care. Take a genuine interest in people)
- **Encouraging** (Everyone goes through tough times. When you support people and encourage them through these times, you'll be inspiring them to see the best in themselves and the situation.)
- **Be inspired yourself** (Look for people, ideas, environments and knowledge that you find inspiring and motivating.)
- **Share from your own experience** (Mine the rich experiences of your life and share your wisdom from your unique point of view.)
- **Be vulnerable** (Be willing to share your failures as well as your successes. Others will relate to you. They'll understand that they're not the only ones with challenges.)
- **Tell stories** (Facts tell and stories sell. They inspire too. We learn best from parables and we all need to develop our own inspiring stories.)
- **Be a good communicator** (Watch how you speak and what you say)
- **Challenge people** (Many of us have had teachers who at times seemed more like tormentors than mentors. They challenged us to do our best.)

In our school community of over 460 children, 50 staff and community members we all have dreams. In our school community there may be the child who grows up to discover the cure for cancer, or the child who is able to solve the crisis in the Middle East, or a child that is able resolve world poverty. At different times in the past two years children from Sacred Heart have expressed a desire to resolve these three issues. It is up to each one of us to challenge and inspire our children to get closer to these dreams.

Each one of these examples is further modelled for us by Jesus. He shows us how we can be better team players by reflecting 'Jesus values' of compassion, kindness, forgiveness, tolerance, understanding, patience, welcome and joy. These are values that each one of us can demonstrate each and every day. We don't need to be saints, we just need to be "switched on" to the needs of our community.

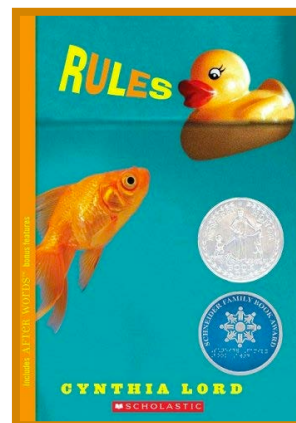

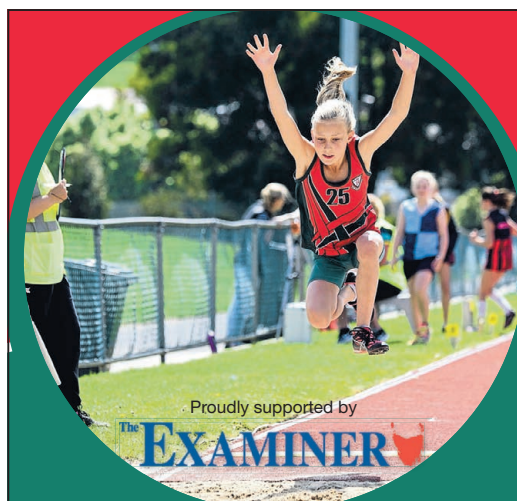

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- ❖ Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from **8:00am** each school day for any students.
- ❖ **Students are not to arrive before 8am**
- ❖ If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. **The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.**
- ❖ The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Reminder that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds without prior permission from the Principal

TOILET ACCESS AFTER HOURS

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.
