Oral Language

This year at Sacred Heart our teaching and learning focus has been on developing students' oral language skills. Oral language encompasses two components. Expressive language (speaking) is the use of words and non-verbal processes to share meaning with others. Receptive language (listening) is the process of understanding what has been expressed.



Oral language is the student's first, most important and frequently used medium of communication. It is the foundation for the development of literacy skills which is considered to be a strong indicator of future reading, writing and overall academic achievement. Oral language skills become progressively sophisticated throughout the primary years and permeate into every area of our primary school curriculum.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- •email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- ·use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
- -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Reminder - Before School expectations

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

- Mrs. Deb Scott will be at school from 8:00am each school day for any students.
- Students are not to arrive before 8am
- If a student is here before 8:30 a.m. they need to go to the Gym. The cost will be \$2 per child per day, which needs to be paid as the student arrives at the Presentation Gym.
- The child's name will also be recorded on an attendance sheet on a daily basis.

Reminder that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds without prior permission from the Principal

TOILET ACCESS AFTER HOURS

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.

UPDATE OF TERMS OF ENROLMENT

As you may be aware, in 2015 new Terms of Enrolment were introduced across all Catholic Education Commission Tasmania schools. As part of our ongoing commitment to providing the best possible educational experience, we have continued to monitor and revise the Terms of Enrolment. We will therefore be introducing a small number of updates to the Terms of Enrolment, which will apply to all current enrolments continued in 2018 as well as to new enrolments.

As always, the commitment to our families is that no child will be denied a Catholic education due to financial hardship. Therefore, while there will be some administrative changes at the school, we will continue to work with all of our students' families to ensure that the pastoral needs of our students are met. None of the updates will impact upon the responsibility for fee payment or any other administrative arrangements which you have entered into with the school.

Please click on the below link to see a full copy of our new Terms of Enrolment, which you should read carefully.

Revised Terms Of Enrolments

To summarise, the key changes include:

- •A new request for Medicare card information, which may be given to medical providers in the event that your child requires medical treatment in your absence;
- *Clarification of the notice period to be given where a child will be withdrawn from the school. Importantly, it should be noted that parents are required to give **ten (10) school weeks**' notice of withdrawal of a student. This does not include school holiday weeks;
- *Revised wording of the 'Students with Additional Needs' section due to government data collection requirements;
- •Revised wording in relation to publication of photographs and/or videos which your child appears in to reflect the possible use of such material in the National Educational Access Licence for Schools. This is a licence between education departments of the various states and territories, allowing school to use licenced material for educational purposes only;
- •Clarification regarding arrangements for payment, indemnities, suspension and termination of enrolment to reflect existing practices.

By continuing your child's enrolment in 2019 from Monday 21 January 2019, you will be taken to have accepted these updates to the Terms of Enrolment.
