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

Last week I played as part of the State team in the School Sport Australia Touch Football National Tournament, at Wentworth Park, Clarence Street, Howrah, Hobart. All states and Territories participated in this event and included referees from everywhere around Australia.

We played two games every day, we had a 3 game break in between each day. On Monday Tassie played South Australia then Northern Territory. On Tuesday we played New South Wales and Victoria, NSW were tough but we didn't give up. Then on Wednesday we had an Educational day at Blundstone Arena with presentations from Tasmanian elite athletes and the Tasmanian Institutes of Sport.

On Thursday we played Western Australia and Queensland. The QLD girls were tougher than NSW but we stood them up with great defence and worked hard as a team to keep the score just one more than in our game against NSW. Then on Friday we played against ACT then had the final for 7th or 8th against NT, this was a closely fought game going into extra time or as we call it in Touch, a drop off.

All scores and other teams are on the website and in Tuesday's Examiner. We may have lost all our games but we played as a team, improving each game and the last couple games we played were the best. QLD and NSW players are born playing touch in preparation for Rugby League so it's always going to be a tough competition against their teams but our Tassie teams are proud of how we played against them.

Next year's National Tournament will be in Canberra, it would be great to have Sacred Heart students representing Tasmania there.

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Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

-You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave

early.

-Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the

school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Even though it is a parent responsibility to make arrangements for the supervision of your children before 8:30 a.m., S.H.S. offer an arrangement for families who need their children to be arriving at school earlier.

Student toilets are locked daily at approximately 3:15pm-3:30pm. There is a toilet located in the administration building, which is opened until 4:00pm daily.


