From the Principal:

"Pupil Free Day"

"Educating is not a profession but an attitude, a way of being; in order to educate it is necessary to transform ourselves to be among young people, to accompany them in the stages of their growth and to set ourselves beside them. Give them hope and optimism for their journey in the world. Teach them to see the beauty and goodness of creation and of humanity who always retains the Creator's hallmark. But above all, with your life, be witnesses of what you communicate." (Pope Francis)

Sacred Heart has two founding orders that our charism is built upon, Presentation Sisters and Christian Brothers. The Presentation Sisters established our school in 1873. The Christian Brothers have been connected to our school since 1919. This year our Leadership Team discussed and agreed to spend time with staff discovering more about the Christian Brothers.

On Monday our staff spent time working with Edmund Rice Australia. Edmund Rice Australia work with schools across our nation that are Christian Brother schools.

We learnt that a charism is 'the burning desire in the heart of the founder, who was alive at one period of history, living on in others in another day and age, developing and growing in a new way.' (Joan Chittester). Charism is about evolving and giving new life in new ways. And so for Sacred Heart it is our responsibility to consistently consider 'What is needed here from us for a fair, just and compassionate response?'

Edmund Rice was a successful businessman who took inspiration from his reading of the Gospels to address the plight of Catholic children faced from an oppressive, political situation, and a future without the prospect of employment, leading to a life of poverty, powerlessness and a life of economic dependence. He had the strength and generosity to devote himself to the needs of others, especially young people. He established his first school in 1802. Today Sacred Heart and schools and ministries across the world are part of his legacy through his founding of the Christian Brothers.

Our staff, through research and discussion, described Rice as empathetic, inclusive, philanthropist, compassionate, driven, generous, persistent, courageous, relational, 'Christ like', visionary, caring, challenger of social norms, selfless, prayerful, humble and passionate.

Through the course of the day we explored 6 Catholic Social Teachings

- The Dignity of the Human Person ('Everyone is unique')
- Solidarity ('We are all in this together')
- Common Good ('What matters most is what is best for everyone')
- Preferential option for the poor ('Some people need extra support')
- The integrity of creation ('Our planet and all life on it deserves our care')
- · Subsidiarity ('People should have a say and be listened to!')

We linked the Catholic Social Teachings to our Sacred Heart Pillars

- · Catholicity
- Culture
- Collaboration
- Communication
- Capacity
- Curriculum

This process was both critical and affirming as it demonstrated how the Pillars of Sacred Heart provides a connection with our past and a clear direction of how we behave moving into the future.

Throughout the course of the day we mapped and considered what roles each one of us plays in the story of SHS? We were challenged to reflect that community only exists because of the contribution of the past. Community is a place where we should continue to give and receive. We concluded our day by considering

- · What do I bring to the SHS community?
- What skills and talents do I or should I be sharing with SHS?
- What do I do that I should change for the better at SHS?
- What am I grateful for at SHS?

I wonder how each one of us would answer these questions in order to improve the lives of others at our school?

Grade 5 and 6 Parent and Student Survey (see page 9 for more info)

The State Government has recently created a Taskforce to help address homelessness for children and young people under 16 in Tasmania, The Department of Communities Tasmania are helping the Taskforce by gathering feedback from children, young people, parents, carers and services (including schools / educators) to hear about their experiences and listen to their ideas on what the Taskforce should recommend to Government to help improve under 16 homelessness in Tasmania.

Communities Tasmania have developed a confidential online survey to gain feedback from children & young people - ie students in Years 5 - 10 (Survey Qs 1-12) as well as from parents, carers, schools / educators (Survey Qs 1 & 5 - 12). The attached Poster gives details on accessing the Survey. It will be open from 22 July until 20 September 2019.

Catholic Education Tasmania is certainly keen to assist the Taskforce. Even though not intended, some may find filling in the Survey confronting, and so potential completion by our students needs to take place within the pastoral care and wellbeing context offered by our families. For the families who fill in the survey it is intended that children complete a separate survey to parents. The survey is only to be completed for children from Grade 5 and 6 and their parents.

Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- · email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- · use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- · advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
 - -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine


