#### From the Acting Principal:


"Too often we forget that discipline really means to teach, not to punish. A disciple is a student, not a recipient of behavioural consequences."

(Dr Dan Siegal The Whole Brain Child)

Last week I attended professional learning in Campbell Town that discussed brain development and how the brain affects children's behaviour. Dan Siegal discusses the idea of the brain having mental "brakes" and "accelerators". The mental "accelerator" is the part of the brain that reacts and responds to threats around us, activated when we are scared by telling us to flight, fight or freeze. The mental 'brake' however is the part of the brain that helps us to be self controlled, organised and to reason.

As children mature they are more able to respond to situations with the mental 'brakes' and to control the mental 'accelerator'. These two parts of the brain compete with one another to accelerate and react or to keep calm and in control, a state which Siegal calls 'toggling'. Children who toggle learn to tolerate negative emotional reactions and children who develop this ability learn to respect and follow the instructions given by adults. As adults we can assist with this development by allowing children to toggle in order to learn to manage difficult emotions and manage impulsive behaviour.

So what does this mean for us as adults in a practical sense? How can we support children? Siegal suggests that when we see children in the process of decision making we give them space to choose, not to jump in to comfort them or to get angry. When they do demonstrate the ability to use their mental 'brakes' to illustrate self-control, notice and recognise the good decision they have made. Siegal is not suggesting that children are allowed to dictate the situation and determine the outcome instead promoting clear, firm boundaries with a 1:5 ratio of negative versus positive attention and feedback.

#### Student absences

If your child will be absent from school please remember to either:

- call the School office on 63311011
- · email shsl@catholic.tas.edu.au
- · use the Skoolbag app, fill out an eForm
- · advise their teacher

If you arrive at school after 9am your child must be walked into the office via the York Street gate and report to the school office to update our records and avoid unnecessary absentee text messages.

It is a legal requirement that parents are expected to advise the school as to why their child is absent.

#### Signing students out during the day

- -You must sign your child out if you need to pick them up from school for an appointment or for your child to leave early.
  - -Please pre-arrange this with your child's class teacher and the teacher will send your child to the office at the required time so you can collect them from the office and sign them out.

#### WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

#### **How to apply for a WWVP and Number**

- 1. Complete the online application form <a href="https://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children">www.justice.tas.gov.au/working-with-children</a>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

#### Fire Alarm

A reminder that if in the instance a fire alarm is sounded whilst parents are on the school site, you are required to assemble on the oval. Students remain with teachers as part of the process is for the staff to ensure all students are accounted for. If parked on York when the fire engine arrives it is vital that you vacate the area to allow the fire engine access.
