## One Step at a Time.....

Many families would have enjoyed the freedom of the long weekend and the subsequent restrictions lifted by our Government with regard to COVID-19. Our school restrictions remain the same.

Almost three weeks ago our school returned to the 'new normal'. What does the 'new normal' look like at SHS?

- Our class celebrations of our Catholic faith are conducted in class groupings and are shared on the ZOOM.
- Kindergarten 2021 Interviews have also been held via ZOOM
- Children are participating in the 'Daily Mile' (A 15 minute jog/run/walk around our school grounds designed to enhance physical well being)
- Assemblies are held in class groupings and shared via ZOOM
- Leadership Staff greet children at the entrances to our school.
- Our SHS Board meet via ZOOM.
- · Grade 6 children are available to walk children to class.
- Drop off and Pick up arrangements have been adjusted to enable a safe and smooth transition from home to school.

These actions are designed to support children and families. They complement the ongoing support our teachers provide each and every day.

This week I asked several of our children their thoughts on the 'return to school' and the changes in and around our school. Included below are a list of some of the responses.

- I'm just so happy to be back with all my friends.
- I enjoyed having extra time with my family and the simple things we did, like extra cooking and gardening.
- Don't tell Mum and Dad, but I'd much rather my teacher was helping me with my schoolwork.
- I'm able to concentrate much better when I'm at SHS, I don't have to put up with my brother interrupting me all the time.
- I can't wait until the new 'all-weather court' is complete.

A few personal observations...

- The noise children make is unique and uplifting. In the first few days of Learning@School it was obvious that more than 450 children were back in force. Laughing, encouraging and enjoying one another's company.
- Our Teachers and Support Staff were genuinely excited to have all of the children back with us, to continue their learning journey.
- Zooms are designed to be helpful in our roles, but there is a limit. :)
- Our parent community has been incredible in the manner in which they
  are supporting the changes to school routines.

## **Reporting to Parents**

Catholic Education Tasmanian (CET) have made changes to our Mid Year Reporting to Parents structures. - Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.

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Dear Parents / Guardians,

We have been given advice from Catholic Education Tasmania (CET) that the Launceston Catholic Schools Instrumental Music Program can recommence. The program will restart as of the normal lesson times this week in your primary school. As we prepare for this, there are some things that you need to be made aware of. These points have been listed below.

#### **NO CHANGE:**

- Time and date remain the same at your school;
- Same tutor / groups / books;
- Same expectations;
- Same length of lesson;
- Can still seek assistance from your instrument tutor. DIFFERENT:

#### DIFFERENT:

- Less / no large group playing;
- More hygiene procedures;
- More physical distance between some instrument groups;
- No sharing of equipment ie; can't give a new reed to someone if they forgot theirs;
- No live performances in the near future (at this stage);
- More time to learn new music and new skills along with now being able to access the online Music site for extra help;
- Different start and end to lessons due to hand washing etc;
- Some groups might be in a new teaching space;
- If you son / daughter is slightly unwell they are not to participate;
- Each Band student will be given a 'cleaning' pack that they will be responsible for to take home and launder the cloth/s provided and return them for use in their next lesson.

For the program to continue without any issues, the DIFFERENT measures put in place will need to be strictly adhered to. The most effective preventative measure is good hand hygiene so please ensure students and yourselves use sanitiser before and after lessons please.

We thank you once again for your patience over this very different period of time and we look forward to a successful remainder of the year.
