Encourage everyone, even children not in your house.


Lots of bucket filling and no put-downs. The day is all about doing your personal best and having fun!

Teaching Our Children the 'Skills' for Building Healthy Friendships

The reality is that none of us are born automatically knowing how to be a good friend or how to respond when we are faced with conflict or find ourselves on the receiving end of mean-on-purpose behaviour. Conflict is a natural part of the 'friend-o-cycle'. We are bound to have misunderstandings and disagreements, even with the people who we are closest to, however it is how we respond to conflict that counts. (We prefer to use the term 'mean-on-purpose' rather than 'bullying' because the word 'bullying' is often misunderstood, overused, misused and is disempowering. Whereas, using the term mean-on-purpose, enables us to take action to stop mean-on-purpose behaviour in its tracks and is far more empowering!)

We need to <u>learn</u> the skills to manage relationship challenges in healthy ways and then practice these skills until they become automatic responses! The added challenge for us parents, is that most of us were never taught these skills as children. We were pretty much left to flounder and find our own way through the myriad of friendship issues and conflicts we faced. So how then can we know how to teach these skills to our children when we never actually learned them ourselves?! As parents, we can actually learn alongside our children. It is important that we are open to learning too, so that we don't unintentionally make our children's friendship fires bigger, rather than helping them to put their friendship fires out and grow healthier friendships.

At Sacred Heart School we are explicitly teaching our students URSTRONG's Friendship skills and strategies to equip them to navigate conflict (Friendship Fires) and to respond to mean-on-purpose behaviour in healthy ways. The most effective way to support your children in their friendships is to become familiar with URSTRONG's language and skills, so that when your children face challenges, you can reinforce the strategies and skills at home too. You are able to access URSTRONG's Parent Resource Centre for free here (simply use the coupon code URSTRONG to access membership for free)! This will enable you to do activities with your child at home, watch the 'Language of Friendship' videos series and familiarise yourself with the language and skills that your children are learning at school too. We want to be supporting children to put out their friendship fires, so that as a result of conflict their friendships grow closer and stronger. We also want students to be able to use their strategies to stand up to mean-on-purpose behaviour, teaching others how to treat them. If your child is struggling with a friendship or mean-on-purpose behaviour, it is important that you encourage them to also speak to their teacher about it, (as we can only help with things that we know about). We can work together to grow healthy friendships and relationships in our school community if we follow the steps outlined in the poster (next page).

A firefighter from the Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) is visiting our school next week 7th to 10th September and also 21st to 24th September to present a Home Fire Safety Program to our Prep to Grade 6 students.

Kindergarten students, whilst not receiving a structured lesson, can expect a visit from the firefighter who will leave some free fun activites for the students to complete.

The age appropriate program is designed to raise fire awareness in children and includes fun in class activities, videos, activity books, website www.tfseducation.com.au and giveaways.

Parents and other family members are also encouraged to participate by reading the information and assisting your child with the after school activities.

The TFS aims to deliver appropriate fire safety education to every primary school child in Tasmania and is part of the TFS's ongoing commitment to create a fire safe Tasmania.

Key Fire Safety Messages include,

Wake up - Install a smoke alarm in every bedroom

Plan and practice a home fire escape plan with the whole family

In a fire crawl low and go, go, go to the nearest exit

In an emergency call triple zero

Keep flammable material at least two metres from the heater

If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, rock and roll

Keep matches and lighters away from children

Cooking - Turn it off before you turn away

Cool a burn under cold water for at least 20 minutes

Most house fires can be avoided. Make your home fire safe

EARLY CHILDHOOD

TFS receives regular requests from preschools and child care centres asking for firefighters to visit and teach children about home fire safety.

TFS does not deliver structured fire safety programs to children below primary school age. This decision was made based on research carried out by the Mental Health Services of the Royal Children's Hospital and the Metropolitan Fire Brigade in Melbourne. This research indicated that:

- Children under the age of five had low retention of the information they had learned; and
- In some children, the information had actually stimulated their curiosity about fire and they had begun to play with fire.

TFS believes that parents and caregivers are the best people to make sure that very young children are safe from fire. To help with this, TFS has a <u>fire safety website</u> for parents, carers, teachers and students

TFS has also developed resources for young children that introduce them to the friendly firefighter characters that they will meet when they receive the School Fire Education Program including a colouring book, a money box shaped like a fire truck, and stickers with home fire safety messages for the whole family.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
