Searching for the good in one another

"Tolerance and celebration of individual differences is the fire that fuels lasting love." (Tom Hannah)

On Saturday evening Fr Mark reflected on the gospel reading in his homily. He challenged us all to look for the good in one another. More especially he reminded us that it is incumbent on all of us to build one another up, to look for the good in other people rather than isolating the mistakes that they make.

I reflected back to the previous Friday night at the Strings Soiree. Sacred Heart children had played several pieces of music along with our Launceston Catholic Primary schools. The night was another opportunity to showcase the talents of children with family, friends and teachers. Amongst the many performers there were some musical 'mistakes'. Yet the children continued performing to the audience, seemingly proud of their efforts. On nights like these they remind me of the importance of the people that have contributed to the children's efforts, parents who consistently encourage the children to practise, musical tutors who assist by teaching and encouraging and family and friends who also support the children. Just imagine for a moment if one of these performers, instead of positive encouragement, was provided with words of derision and negativity. It is safe to say that the children are less likely to be standing on stage feeling confident or even bothering to stand on stage at all.

Each week at school there are examples of children having disagreements. Sometimes inappropriate words or physical actions are exchanged. Sacred Heart Catholic School always works with children regardless of whether they have done something wrong or whether something has been done to them. Most importantly we discuss with each child, appropriate choices and what they could do better for the future. Sometimes children will repeat poor behaviours several times. Just as when children are learning to read they may need several opportunities to sound words correctly they may also need to practise how to play appropriately on multiple occasions. As parents and teachers it is critical that we continue to encourage children to support children in their learning journey regardless of whether it is learning to read or learning to play.

Take a moment to reflect this week on how you respond to your child and how you respond about other children. As adults we should never lose sight of the fact that our children, and others, are looking and listening to us to set the example for them to follow.

What example will we set?

Wellbeing Update

As parents, much to our distress, we can't always control what happens in our children's worlds. We can do our best to safeguard our children, however, we can't protect them 24hrs a day! Nor is it actually helpful for us to do so because our kids need to develop their own resilience which only comes from growing through challenges. As well as setting limits and boundaries, particularly around their safe use of technology, we can also support our children in their wellbeing by teaching them skills and strategies that they can use to stand up to mean-on-purpose behaviour. This will enable them to keep themselves safe when they feel disrespected or encounter things in the world that make them feel uncomfortable or unsafe.

When faced with mean-on-purpose behaviour, we are teaching our students to use <u>URSTRONG's</u> empowering three step approach:

Step 1: Use a quick comeback, (A quick comeback is a short phrase, that won't get them into trouble, that tells the person who is being mean that what they did or said was NOT ok!) A quick comeback could be "Stop it", "Not Cool", "Just stop" "Not fair". When delivering a quick comeback they need to use strong, calm body language, good eye contact, no smiles, and they must say it like they mean it.

Step 2: Walk away (When you walk away you take your power with you!)

Step 3: Report it to a Teacher/Adult (This step is REALLY important, because we can only support our children to navigate the things we know about).

We teach other people how to treat us and we want them to treat us with respect! We need to reinforce with our children that they must follow through on **all three steps** for their efforts to be successful in stopping mean-on-purpose behaviour in its tracks. Also, if we are all using the same language and approach and supporting our children to practice and use these skills, both at school and at home they will be much more effective too.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
