We will therefore be introducing a small number of updates to the Terms and Conditions, which will apply to all current enrolments continued in 2020 as well as to new enrolments from 2021.

The changes made to the Terms and Conditions to note are as follows:

- Clause 10. Special payment arrangements has been changed to reflect upcoming changes to the Fee Assistance Policy; and
- The inclusion of an additional paragraph addressing disclosure of personal and sensitive information for information management purposes.
- The introduction of an additional clause in relation to referrals to School Support Services.

By continuing your child's enrolment in 2021 from Monday 18 January 2021, you will be taken to have accepted these updates to the Terms and Conditions.

To whom it may concern,

At Metro we're passionate about safety, and this October we're focussing on reducing the number of falls on our buses.

As a key passenger group, students can play an important role in supporting everyone to be safe on board. Please help us communicate this important advice to your school community.

In addition to talking to our drivers and community groups about ways to stay safe, we're asking passengers to:

- · leave priority seats available for those in need
- · offer seats to priority passengers
- move down the bus to leave spaces towards to front clear
- place bags in luggage racks to maximise seated and standing capacity

These tips are important because most falls occur when a senior or disabled passenger boards but is not seated or holding on by the time the bus moves away from the stop.

For many of our customers, safe transport is critical to quality of life, and a stumble or fall on board can seriously affect confidence and independence.

Sacred Heart will be utilising St Patrick's College canteen for lunches for Prep to Grade 6, two days a week.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working with children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
