Our Community

Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School core purpose is to provide the best possible Catholic education for all students. As a collective of staff and parents we should always be aspiring to provide the children of our school with opportunities to grow closer in their relationship to Christ.

Our immediate school community of children, parents and staff is made up of over 1000 people. We all know when more than 1000 people interact there will be many times of excitement and agreement and equally there are times when we don't agree with one another and the decisions that are made. Life is like that.

This year has been like no other for any of us. As a school community parents have had fewer opportunities to spend time with their children at school either at community events or simply walking them into our school grounds, children have had some of their events cancelled or changed and staff have had significant changes to the way they teach and interact. Every member of our school in 2020 has had to do things differently because of the circumstances surrounding the impact of COVID-19.

As Principal of Sacred Heart I'm proud of the way our community has responded in 2020. We know it has been challenging for children, staff and parents as we all adapt to the changes. I was speaking to a close friend recently, he is a Principal in Victoria. We were sharing stories about our communities. What became very obvious from our discussions was the things that had happened at his school were similar to ones that had happened at Sacred Heart. The challenge his school has is they have had more severe restrictions that have continued even longer than ours. Our conversation reminded me whilst I was faced with challenges, his community was facing more difficult circumstances.

One of the key areas our staff have continued to highlight throughout this year has been supporting the well-being of our school community. As a school we very deliberately focussed on supporting the wellbeing of all of our students when they returned from learning@home. We were conscious that many children had spent time away from school and friends, had spent less time in physical activities and may have been impacted mentally and emotionally by the impact of COVID restrictions. We reminded our children that resilience is a key part of our wellbeing and in particular how we respond. We reminded our children that their attitude to a challenge would affect their wellbeing.

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Our Community (con't)

Questions we regularly pose to the children of Sacred Heart are

- •What are you grateful for today?
- •Have you reflected on the goodness in your life and thanked those that make that happen?
- •How do you respond when faced with challenges? Do you look for a solution or look to blame?

As adults we should also consider what behaviours we are modelling to our children. As a member of the Sacred Heart community it is up to us to set the example when disappointment or disagreement with decision making presents. Our children are watching us and will take cues from each one of us.

•What face do you want your child to see?

Take a moment this week to consider these questions for yourself. Sharing your gratitude with others not only improves their wellbeing but enhances your own. Presenting your children with a growth mindset and a positive attitude does and will rub off on them.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
