COVID Plan for SHS

Last week we reminded parents of the following information.

Bound by faith - linked together by our love of God, in our church family, growing in our relationship with Him.


In Jesus' Image - in all we do and all we are, we try to be like Jesus. We consider what He would have done, what He would have said and how He would have reacted in all areas of our lives.
