We are a diverse community made up of more than 460 children, in excess of 50 staff and 900 parents. Each and every one of us is different. Different in the way we look, the way we behave, what we believe and how we approach things. The one thing we all have in common is a close connection to Sacred Heart.

One of the great strengths of our school is the diversity of our community. Interacting with people of different cultures, backgrounds and thinking strengthens our own capacity to broaden our own thinking and ideas. As a nation Australia has one of the most culturally diverse populations in the world. These cultures have added to the richness of our First Nations people and have made Australia what it is today, a place that is safe to live in and one that aspires to respect all.

As a school one of our core PBS values is 'Respect for Others'. This is proudly displayed on every newsletter, our website and in several places in and around our school. The children of SHS learn these values very quickly. We work with them to 'break open' what respect means and looks like.

We must continue to challenge ourselves and one another to be 'people of the cross'. Just as Jesus spent time with the lepers and the outcasts (Mark 1: 40-45) we are called to treat everyone with respect.

Children will sometimes come home sharing details about an interaction at school that hasn't gone well. Perhaps they were called a name, perhaps they heard poor language or maybe there was inappropriate physical contact. Often they will share the name of a child who had behaved inappropriately. How we respond as adults is critical. We can choose to blame the other child or we can choose to support our child in how they should respond. We should certainly speak with SHS. We should never speak badly about other children in front of our children. We are adults and if we want our children to develop skills of tolerance, compassion and respect we must reflect these ourselves.

Our children watch and listen to us closely, they will model our behaviours. They are the future leaders of our society. It is incumbent on us to model to our future generation of global citizens to search for the good in others.

Riverside Pool COVID requirements are:

- •Parents are able to attend the carnival but are not permitted to interact with the children during the carnival.
- •We have also been advised that under the Riverside COVID plan for carnivals there is a maximum of 150 parents for school carnivals. (NIJSSA Swimming Carnival is only allowing officials to attend).
- •This means families may only send one adult as a spectator (younger children don't count).
- •For those parents acting as officials, they don't count in the 150, this means those families may still send a spectator as well as the official.
- •Riverside Pool have also advised us that parents/grandparents are not permitted to use the toilets under their COVID Plan. Parents will need to access the toilets at the Riverside shopping centre, a short walk from the pool.

Families have for many years taken photos and videos of their children competing. Please respect other children by not taking photos of them. Be conscious of any social media posts. Remember you are within your rights to post photos/videos of your own child but we have some children at SHS that their parents have decided not to allow social media posts.

Collection Notice for parents/guardians 2021 Student Residential Address and Other Information

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to advise you that a request has been made for your child's school to provide residential address and other information as required under the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (Cth).

The school is required to provide the department with the following information about each student at the school:

- Names and residential addresses of students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Student residential address (excluding student names)
- Whether the student is a primary or secondary student (education level)
- Whether the student is boarding or a day student (boarding status).

Your child's school generates a **unique and unidentifiable** record number for each student record. The number is **only** used by the school for this collection. **It is not allowed to be used for any other purpose**. The number indicates to the department that each record provided is for one student.

Purpose of the collection

The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (the Collection) informs Australian Government school education policy and helps ensure funding for non-government schools is based on need.

The information collected will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate a non-government school community's anticipated capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling.

From 2020, a new measure of capacity to contribute, the Direct Measure of Income (DMI), was introduced. The DMI is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school using data collected through the Collection. More information about the DMI can be found at https://www.education.gov.au/what-direct-measure-income.

Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law under the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (Privacy Act). Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with Privacy Act and the *Australian Education Act 2013* and *Australian Education Regulation 2013*.

Your personal information provided to the department through the Collection may be:

- disclosed to the ABS for the purposes of capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as a part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information about MADIP can be found on the MADIP page on the ABS website.
- disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department may from time to time, carry out an audit of
 a school's submission to the Collection. The contracted auditor compares the school's submission with
 the student enrolment information held by the school and will not use the information for any other
 purpose
- disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology support services to the department
- used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

The department does not intend to disclose your personal information to any overseas recipients.

The department's privacy policy can be found at www.dese.gov.au and includes information on:

- how individuals can access and seek correction of the personal information held by the department;
- how complaints about potential breaches or breaches of the Privacy Act can be made;
- how the department will deal with these complaints.

The department commissioned an independent privacy impact assessment (PIA). The PIA assesses the flows of information under the Collection, compliance with the Privacy Act and measures in place to safeguard the personal information being collected. The report is being updated, and will be available in 2021 on the SchoolsHUB Address Collection help and support page. The current version is available at https://docs.education.gov.au/node/51436.

What do you need to do?

You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department; however, you may wish to ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.

We believe music is an excellent accomplishment and an important part of a well rounded, balanced education.

Learning music from an early age enables neural pathways to grow in ways that can help your child maximise the potential they were born with. Research shows that playing music can make significant differences to children's abilities related to learning, memory and social interactions.





WEEKLY LESSONS: Lessons are arranged on a weekly basis. The lessons are taken by tutors at YOUR school on the same day, at the same time. This makes it easy to schedule.

MUSIC SOUREES: (Gatherings) are held twice a year. All students, regardless of their standard or experience, can perform at a Soiree if they wish. They must have a piece well prepared and ready for performances - the tutors advise the Program Director of students willing and ready to perform.

WORKSHOP DAYS: Combined schools workshop days will be held throughout the year in preparation for the end of year concert. This is a great way for students to mix with students from other schools and build a sense of teamwork.

MAJOR CONCERT: A combined schools concert will be held for all invited guests, students, staff, parents and friends at the end of the year to celebrate the vear's achievements.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
