Reach for the Stars

I remember when my two girls were born. I remember holding them for the first time. I remember when they first walked. I remember their first days of school, their last days of Primary school. In the past few weeks they have recommenced their University studies. Life changed when they left home to pursue studies and dreams. As parents we remember listening to the dreams of our children. As a four year old my eldest daughter wanted to be a vet and the youngest a princess "when they grew up". They both still have dreams.

Where do these dreams come from? Children are born with vivid imaginations. Imaginations just like bodies need nourishing. Our responsibility as parents and educators is to inspire others, and in particular children. How can we do that?

We can inspire others by

- *Being a good example* (People watch what you do more than they listen to what you say. Be someone worth emulating)
- *Caring about others* (People don't care about how much you know until they know how much you care. Take a genuine interest in people)
- *Encouraging* (Everyone goes through tough times. When you support people and encourage them through these times, you'll be inspiring them to see the best in themselves and the situation.)
- *Be inspired yourself* (Look for people, ideas, environments and knowledge that you find inspiring and motivating.)
- *Share from your own experience* (Mine the rich experiences of your life and share your wisdom from your unique point of view.)
- *Be vulnerable* (Be willing to share your failures as well as your successes. Others will relate to you. They'll understand that they're not the only ones with challenges.)
- *Tell stories* (Facts tell and stories sell. They inspire too. We learn best from parables and we all need to develop our own inspiring stories.)
- *Be a good communicator* (Watch how you speak and what you say)
- *Challenge people* (Many of us have had teachers who at times seemed more like tormentors than mentors. They challenged us to do our best.)

In our school community of over 460 children, 50 staff and community members we all have dreams. In our school community there may be the child who grows up to discover the cure for cancer, or the child who is able to solve the crisis in Myanmar, or a child that is able to resolve world poverty. At different times in the past five years children from Sacred Heart have expressed a desire to resolve these three issues. It is up to each one of us to challenge and inspire our children to get closer to these dreams.

School Uniform

Commencing 2022 Prep children will wear Sports Uniform 5 days a week.

- 2022 Kinder and Prep will wear Sports Uniform full time
- 2023 Kinder to Grade 1 Sports Uniform
- 2024 Kinder to Grade 2 Sports Uniform

The process is quite easy, just follow the instructions to create an account and a profile for each child.

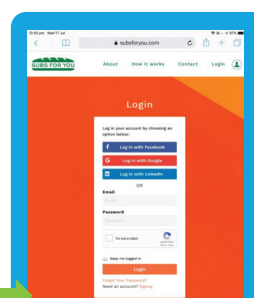
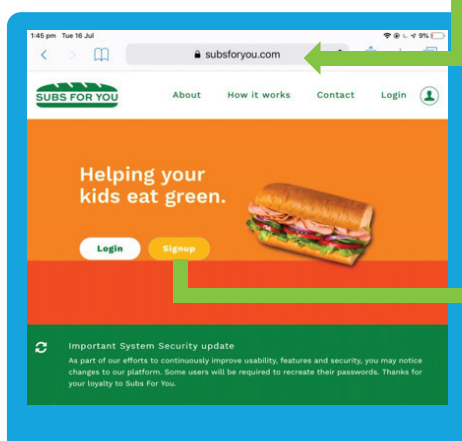

Subs for You, Account Set-Up



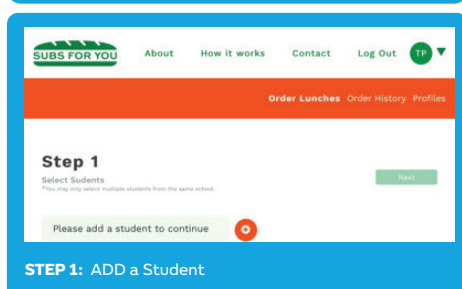

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
