**Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus....**

Each year on the Friday following Corpus Christi, we celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart. This celebration has been in place since 1856, but the devotion to the Sacred Heart goes back to the Middle Ages as one of the most enduring and popular devotions in the Catholic Church.

The heart has always been seen as the centre or essence of a person.

We use expressions such as: the heart of the matter, you are my heart, and take it to heart to emphasise this.

We also express our feelings using heart imagery - you break my heart, or my heart sings.

The heart emoji is used consistently to respond in social media comments.



In so many ways, the heart is both our life-blood and source of our happiness.

We honour the physical heart of Jesus as an emblem of his great love for us. St John Paul 11 during his homily on this feast day in 1984 said:

In the Sacred Heart, every treasure of wisdom and knowledge is hidden. In that divine heart beats God's infinite love for everyone and for each of us as individuals.'

## Sacred Heart Feast Day arrangements

Earlier this week we communicated the following information to families.

On Friday 11th June, our Feast Day, the following additional requirements will apply.

- Parents and visitors are not permitted to attend our Mass in the Church of Apostles
- SHS's Got Talent, commencing at 1.45pm, allows us to permit two parents/adults per participant. This means that the only adults allowed to attend are those whose children are in the performance. (School age siblings and younger are permitted to attend)
- Please do not video or take photos that include children other than your own.
- Remember to sign in via the COVID (Check in Tas) app if you are attending. These will be in the Presentation Hall.

These expectations are additional to our ongoing requirements

- Parents, visitors, staff and students with cold or flu symptoms are not to come to school
- Discouraging visitors and parents attending school unless for an organised meeting
- Adults are required to maintain physical distancing.
- The recording of contact details of visitors to school events held in school venues.
- The recording of contact details of visitors to meetings with staff.
- The provision of hand sanitiser.
- Appropriate COVID safety signage at school entry points.
- Cleaning of frequently touched internal surfaces.

## Archbishop's Charter

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The Archbishop's Charter for Catholic Schools provides the basis for the Archbishop to 'mandate' Catholic schools and colleges within the Archdiocese of Hobart. The mandate of the Archbishop represents his formal commissioning of a Tasmanian Catholic school or college to act as an evangelising agent of the Archdiocese.

Recently Adele Murphy, Anna Davie and I attended a Professional Learning meeting to listen to an overview of expectations for Sacred Heart in responding to the charter. One of the initial tasks was to audit what we do and consider what other ways we can respond. Part of our day was spent considering our role as leaders in a Catholic School. We also reflected on the role all staff have as evangelisers.

The Charter, which draws inspiration from Sacred Scripture and key Church documents, focuses on four domains:

- Catholic Identity
- Learning
- Leadership
- Mission

These domains influence priorities at both the school and system level.

In the week's ahead we will be considering what other ways we can respond to the charter. We will be seeking feedback from staff, parents and students in the near future.

All Tasmanian Catholic schools are expected to respond to the charter on a regular basis. Our school is one of the last to be formally mandated by Archbishop Julian.



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
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## Happy Hearts

**How to apply for a WWVP and Number**

1. Complete the online application form [www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\\_with\\_children](http://www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children)
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

**Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded**
