Presentation Sisters

The staff of Sacred Heart spent Monday's Pupil Free Day building the understanding of the Presentation Sisters and how we can grow their charism amongst the Sacred Heart community.

The Presentation Sisters were founded in 1775 by Nano Nagle to meet the needs of the poor in penal Ireland. Founded from Ireland, Presentation Sisters came to "the ends of the earth" in Australia in 1866. Traditionally, Presentation Sisters in Australia have reached out to poor families through education in Primary Schools, Secondary Colleges and Tertiary Institutions. Today Presentation Sisters and Associates are in every continent across our globe and work to address the "cry of the poor and the cry of the earth" through a variety of social justice initiatives. The early Presentation Sisters and all the Presentation Sisters, Associates and Friends of Nano over the years have been the guardians of Nano's dream to engage in the Mission of God in a distinctive way. Their hopes, their dreams, their passion, their stories live on in us and in all the people around the world who have been inspired or touched by the Presentation charism.

The Society of Australian Congregations of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (PBVM) is a federation of six autonomous Presentation Congregations in Australia and a group of Australian and Melanesian Presentation Sisters in Papua New Guinea.

Presentation Sisters are called to encounter God in the heart of the world and to continue the mission of Jesus in the spirit of our founder Nano Nagle. Like Nano we are called to keep our hearts open to the voices of those who are poor and oppressed, voices which challenge us to conversion and action both personally and communally.

Our staff celebrated the things we already do in our school that recognise the Presentation Charism. We also reflected on what else we could do. In the weeks ahead our Grade 5 and 6 children will be asked to consider these same areas. Shortly parents will receive a survey about the Archbishop's Charter that includes questions with opportunities to answer these aspects.

COVID Update

With the current situation around Australia, I think it is timely to remind you all, of our current Covid related requirements. I wish to thank all of you who have been very supportive and understanding of our current situation. Currently regular school activities are to operate as per normal. We will continue to advise you of any restrictions around special larger events.

Below are our individual responsibilities:

- Anyone who displays cold or flu symptoms must not enter the school site.
- If children display cold or flu symptoms during school time we will be calling you to request you collect your child from school.
- Anyone who is waiting for a Covid test result must not enter the school site.
- Anyone who has travelled to a high-risk area must not enter the school site until cleared by a medical practitioner.
- Anyone requested to quarantine must not enter the school site.

These rules are in place to ensure that we are all kept safe.

We also request that if your child is sick, that you keep them at home, as a day's rest is beneficial for a speedy recovery and prevents the disease from spreading. Over recent weeks we have had many staff members off sick, creating an interruption for the learning of the whole class. Your support is greatly appreciated.








COVID-19 testing for all Tasmanian residents

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.
 If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.
 After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded
