Each and every student at Sacred Heart has potential, Sacred Heart students with potential to achieve and potential to make a positive difference. It is our hope and dream that every child achieves their own dreams and aspirations. Potential can of course remain untapped. There are many examples, in life, of people who haven't made good. Success, no matter how it is measured, requires others to support, to identify, to inspire, to acknowledge, to encourage, to assist and to challenge. As parents we remember listening to the dreams of our children.

Where do these dreams come from? Children are born with vivid imaginations. Imaginations just like bodies need nourishing. Our responsibility as parents and educators is to inspire others, and in particular children. How can we do that?

We can inspire others by

- *Being a good example* (People watch what you do more than they listen to what you say. Be someone worth emulating)
- *Caring about others* (People don't care about how much you know until they know how much you care. Take a genuine interest in people)
- *Encouraging* (Everyone goes through tough times. When you support people and encourage them through these times, you'll be inspiring them to see the best in themselves and the situation.)
- *Be inspired yourself* (Look for people, ideas, environments and knowledge that you find inspiring and motivating.)
- *Share from your own experience* (Mine the rich experiences of your life and share your wisdom from your unique point of view.)
- *Be vulnerable* (Be willing to share your failures as well as your successes. Others will relate to you. They'll understand that they're not the only ones with challenges.)
- *Tell stories* (Facts tell and stories sell. They inspire too. We learn best from parables and we all need to develop our own inspiring stories.)
- *Be a good communicator* (Watch how you speak and what you say)

Challenge people (Many of us have had teachers who at times seemed more like tormentors than mentors. They challenged us to do our best.)

In our school community of 459 children, 52 staff and community members we all have dreams. In our school community there may be the child who grows up to discover the cure for cancer, or the child who is able to make a positive difference towards climate change, or a child that is able to resolve world poverty. At different times in the past five years children from Sacred Heart have expressed a desire to resolve these three issues. It is up to each one of us to challenge and inspire our children to get closer to these dreams.

Our role as educators and parents is critical to assisting our children reach their potential in life. Our roles will vary from supporter, to inspirer, to guide, teacher, challenger and occasionally we 'just need to bring our children back to reality'.

Look around our school this week and notice the 459 children, every one of them has the potential to make a difference in life, maybe as a parent, perhaps as a doctor, maybe as a philanthropist, or a humanist or even a musician.

How will you assist their progress?

It only takes a few positive words or actions to make a difference, to turn a life around, to guide it in the right direction. What words or actions can you and I make to ensure the 459 children at our school reach their potential? As adults we are required to ensure future generations are provided with every opportunity to 'reach the stars and beyond.'

This week ALL of us can either 'stargaze' or 'water the seeds for growth'. Grab your 'own watering can and start watering.'

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded



Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?


This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

You must have a referral to be tested.
If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.
After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.


KEEPING YOUR DISTANCE.
