Relationships

In a school community and indeed in every aspect of our lives, relationships are fundamental and at the heart of social-emotional wellbeing. At times everyone needs assistance to navigate relationships, especially our students who are constantly learning about social skills and friendships. At Sacred Heart we use a program called URStrong to intentionally teach our students about friendship skills, empowering them to create communities of kindness. The program gives students skills, language and self confidence to develop healthy relationships and is a kid-friendly approach used to support and coach students towards positive relationships. By explicitly teaching children how they can develop healthy friendships and sort out conflict respectfully. Below are '10 friendship tips' you can use to discuss with your child. Together, working collaboratively, we can support and guide our students in their social-emotional journey.



10 Friendship Tips for Kids

1. Remember that Friendship Fires® (conflicts) are normal.
2. Wait for the right time when putting out Friendship Fires®. Timing is important!
3. Talk-it-Out by retelling the situation and explaining how you feel. "Remember when... I felt..."
4. Spend the most time with friends in the green-zone of the Friend-o-meter.
5. Spend less time in red-zone friendships if you've tried to put out the Fire® and it's not going out!
6. Focus on what works in each friendship. Do things that bring out the best in your friendship!
7. If it's Mean-on-Purpose, remember to use a Quick Comeback and report to an adult.
8. Remember: You teach people how to treat you!
9. You deserve top-quality friendships. Quality is more important than quantity.
10. Be friendly and kind to everyone. There's a difference between friendly and friendship.




PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS FROM CORONAVIRUS

COVID-19 testing for all Tasmanian residents

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.
If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.
After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
