FIRST READING

Jeremiah 38:4-6. 8-10

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah SECOND READING and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the With so many witness Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank. Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTION


AUGUST: Small Business

Dear Parish Family,

This coming Monday we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As we celebrate the Eucharist for this feast we enter into the wondrous mystery of Mary's presence in the fullness of God. Mary is fully with God because she responded fully to God's initiative in her life. She is our great advocate. With a mother's love she intercedes for us on our pilgrim way to the Father. Pope Francis has a great devotion to Mary. He concludes his first encyclical letter to the Church, *The Joy of* The Gospel, reflecting on Mary, mother of evangelization: she is the Mother of the Church which evangelizes, and without her we could never truly understand the spirit of the new evangelization (EG 284). Let's celebrate well this great feast, which affirms the dignity and destiny of all humanity. With Pope Francis we pray: Mother of the living Gospel, wellspring of happiness for God's little ones, pray for us!

Please keep Fr Richard Ross in your prayers and thoughts. Last Sunday he announced to the Bellerive-Lindisfarne Parish that he has resigned as their parish priest in order to take 12 months leave of absence. But this true peace comes from our deep, uncompromising, "all or nothing" commitment to our Christ. The letter to the Hebrews reassures us of the support of so many witnesses in a great cloud on every side (Hebrews 12:1). We can indeed shake off every thing that hinders us if only we do not lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection (Hebrews 12:2). Fr Mark Freeman
