Please see below an overview of Mr Barry Nas' career as outlined by Catholic Education Tasmania;

The late Barry Nas was a music teacher across Sacred Heart Catholic School for 39 years, and St Thomas More's Catholic School, Newstead for 35 years. But anyone who worked with Barry would know that he was so much more than that. He started out in the Catholic education system as a young male, and early in his career as a teacher having only taught at a Department of Education school for a couple of years, but once he started in Catholic education, he knew that he had found a home. Wendy Nas, Barry's wife, explained how much he loved teaching at Sacred Heart and St Thomas More's. "He loved his role. Teaching music was his passion. He felt it was his job to make sure that everybody enjoys music and I think he did a pretty good job of that."

When Barry started in Catholic education, he was one of the only males that was on staff. There was the Principal, a couple of Christian Brothers, a groundsman and of course, Barry. He had an ability to inspire and uplift the children that he worked with to help develop a love of music, he had an incredible ability to be able to identify and nurture talent within his students and encourage all students to have a go. The kids that he would work with, even those that didn't enjoy music and said that they couldn't do it, were found to realise after a couple of lessons with Mr Nas that they could.

One of the many things that Barry prided himself on doing on a day to day basis, is being a positive person for everybody. The staff that he worked with viewed him as a humble, compassionate, honest, patient, and respectful person, who always had time to help a staff member with whatever issue they were having in their life. His wife believes that the keyboard was his favourite instrument, but he had the ability to play every instrument he attempted to play. "Oh, his favourite was the keyboard, but he prided himself on dabbling in everything. He was a bit of a show pony really."

Barry had a long list of accomplishments throughout his career. These include being asked to feature on one of Andrew Chinn's albums with a select few students from Sacred Heart and St Thomas More's, being the Principal Musician and Choirmaster for the Catholic Education Week Masses, leading Rock and Roll Night for four Launceston Catholic Schools events, being an active participant and supporter of Sacred Heart Parents and Friends Association, and of course the Chocolate Wheel Coordinator at the Sacred Heart and St Thomas More's fairs. "He was always front and centre of anything that was school based. He loved taking hundreds of dollars off people at the Chocolate Wheel at the school fair, even when they didn't really want to. You would walk past, and he reminds you that he knew your mother, or he knew your brother. He just had the gift of the gab."

Wendy said Barry's biggest piece of advice was to believe in the student. Giving a student a chance to thrive in his music class was something that he prided himself on being able to do, and he implored all educators to do the same. He empowered children, staff, and parents by his actions, and always tried to see the good in everyone. That was Barry Nas.

# West Ham Soccer Camp







# **WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION**

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

## How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form <a href="www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children">www.justice.tas.gov.au/working\_with\_children</a>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
