Classes for 2023

Next Wednesday 23rd November parents will be advised of our 2023 teachers via COMPASS.

We will also share details with parents about providing information to Brent that you consider important. Parents will have until 8pm Friday 25th November to email Brent any relevant information. Please read the information below, this is designed to assist you in knowing if you should email Brent.

One of the great strengths of SHS is having 2 classes in each grade (double stream school). This means there are more children to play and learn with, more children to develop friendships with and more opportunities to expand networks. In single stream schools children have no choice as to who is in their class. This means that for the time they are in those schools they will most likely have the same children with them each year.

With class allocations at SHS, our teachers and school are committed to making sure each year the two classes in each grade are as balanced as possible.

Ultimately it is our teachers who know the cohort of approximately sixty children best, it is our teachers that are best positioned to accommodate the needs of all children, it is our teachers that spend hours considering all of the information, it is our teachers that we need to trust that are best informed.

We genuinely do our best with our decision making. Supporting your child's teachers and our school is a crucial part of your child's psychological and academic success at SHS. There are multiple layers to how class placements are allocated that can't possibly be explained completely. Our leaders and teachers put huge amounts of thought into student personalities, learning styles, teaching styles, class sizes and much more.

Parents who have been a part of our school for more than a year would be aware that teachers take this process very seriously.

- When we have finalised classes for 2023 we will be sharing with children first who their teachers are.
- When classes are finalised for 2023 parents who have shared information about their children will not necessarily have any request approved. It is important that parents understand that we will be considering the needs of all when placing children.
- Liking or not liking a teacher or child is not a justifiable reason for a class placement.
- Regardless of whether a parent shares information with our school, all children are considered with equal importance. Your input will be taken into consideration, when we place children we consider the needs of everyone.

In 2022 for 2023 parents who have relevant information for class placements they are required to email me directly: brent.wilson@catholic.tas.edu.au . Please DO NOT email or share your input with teachers.

Parents must email me by no later than Friday 25th November 8pm. After this date information will not be considered. Please consider how valid your email is in light of what has been shared.

APSMO Maths Olympiad

At Sacred Heart some students in Grade 5 and 6 participated in Maths Olympiad again this year. Maths Olympiad is a problem solving competition where individuals compete against other students across Australia and New Zealand. We had 24 students participate this year and they all rose to the challenge, trying their best to answer the questions and displaying resilience in problem solving. Special mention goes to Max Miller who scored in the top 10% and Nate Jephcott, Johaan Alex and Stephanie Gardner who all scored within the top 25%.

In 2022 we extended this problem solving approach to our Grade 3 and 4 students, some of which participated in Maths Explorer. Maths Explorer introduces mathematical problem-solving, adopting a fun, practical, approach that students can relate to. Students worked in collaborative teams to solve the problems and had a great time solving problems with their peers.

After School Pick Up

The positioning of Sacred Heart has always provided some challenges in regards to picking up students after school. We have procedures in place to ensure our main priority of student safety is upheld, so please keep the following in mind.

- Students being picked up are done so from York St or from the turning circle in Margaret St.
- Students catching the bus use the Bourke St gates.
- Parents who park need to be mindful of parking signage and road markings, no standing sites in Bourke St and no parking on York between 2:30 and 3:30
- If parents park across the road they need to cross the road to supervise students instead of calling the students to cross themselves as it is such a busy time of the day.
- Traffic should not be backed up to Margaret St on York St, if it is or your child is not at the gate yet it may be necessary to do a lap to keep the traffic flowing as other cars/buses using the road can not get past.




PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS FROM CORONAVIRUS

COVID-19 testing for all Tasmanian residents

Do you have any cold or flu-like symptoms?

This includes fever, runny nose, cough, sore/itchy throat or shortness of breath.

Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test



You must have a referral to be tested.

If there is no testing clinic in your local area, you can travel outside your municipality to have a test.

After being tested, you must self-isolate at home until you receive your results.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
