Lent

'God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire from seeking his mercy.' (Pope Francis)

The Lenten season began on Ash Wednesday. The children of Sacred Heart spent time in prayer reflecting on what contributions they would make this season. Lent originated from Jesus Christ spending 40 days and 40 nights in the desert fasting.

St. John Paul II says, "Lent is a season of intense prayer, fasting, and concern for those in need. It offers all Christians an opportunity to prepare for Easter by serious discernment about their lives, with particular attention to the word of God which enlightens the daily journey of all who believe."

Preparing for Lent could mean something different for each of us based on our season in life, daily struggles, current prayer life, vocation, and more.

Lent is an opportunity for all of us to reflect. As a child I only ever remember it as being an occasion where we put money in the mission box or gave up chocolate (which never lasted very long) or went more often to church services.

Lent for me now is an opportunity to stop and think about the way I live my life. How I treat the marginalised, consider how I can make changes to the way I do things and ultimately aspire to be the best version of myself. Each one of these requires more careful consideration than giving more dollars and I hope makes a bigger difference to both myself and the lives of others.

Consider what contributions your child may make this Lenten season. Perhaps

- Forgiving others
- Practising almsgiving by doing a good deed or three for others
- Spending extra time in prayer





Call your GP or the Public Health Hotline 1800 671 738 to request a COVID-19 test




You must have a referral to be tested.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1.Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
