Empathy

Last week our Grade 6 class travelled south to Dodges Ferry and the Tasman Peninsula to enjoy 3 days on their final camp at Sacred Heart. All camps present different sorts of challenges to children, and adults. Depending on the child this might range from

- Sleeping away from home
- Trying different meals
- Engaging in challenging activities
- Being patient amongst a group of 50 plus children
- Overcoming tiredness

Our Grade 6 leaders were challenged to rise to the occasion by reflecting empathy.

As a Catholic school we will always celebrate in prayer, and camp is no exception. Our liturgy on camp was from Matthew 5:16. The scripture reads

'You are the light that gives light to the world. A city that is built on a hill cannot be hidden. And people don't light a lamp to hide it under a bowl. They put the light on a lampstand. Then the light shines for all the people in the house. In the same way, you should be a light for other people. Live so that they will see the good things you do.'

We were asked to reflect on this passage with the following questions in mind

- What does this gospel story mean for you?
- How do you let your light shine?
- How can you make your light shine brighter?
- How can you help others let their lights shine?

Reflecting back over the camp there were hundreds of examples when children and adults let their lights shine. One of the enormous privileges of being Principal of Sacred Heart is observing the many daily examples of our community demonstrating empathy towards others.

Living in our diverse community there are times that really challenge us. Perhaps we are confronted with someone else's opinions or actions. Maybe they have done something to us or someone we hold close that upsets us. Life will sometimes present us with circumstances that aren't desirable. Regardless of the situation we are called to truly let our lights shine. Each one of us is special and unique, called to help others and enable their lights to shine and burn brightly.

As we continue our Lenten journey, consider this week how each one of us can be the best person we can be by shining our lights.

Gastroenteritis Outbreak

Public Health Service are aware of gastroenteritis (gastro) outbreaks in the community, including the education sector, and would like to remind parents to please remain vigilant for gastroenteritis and to put in place appropriate measures.

Infectious gastroenteritis ('gastro') is a short-term illness caused by infection and inflammation of the digestive system. Symptoms may include diarrhoea (frequent or loose stools), vomiting and abdominal pain. There are many causes of gastroenteritis, with the most common being a viral infection.

Infectious gastroenteritis is spread very easily. It may be spread via vomit and faeces (poo) of an infected person or contaminated objects, food or water.

Infection control recommendations:

- Children or staff who become unwell with vomiting and/or diarrhoea while at childcare or school should go home.
- Children and staff should not return to childcare or school until at least 48 hours after symptoms have resolved.
- Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after any contact with a sick person
- Staff should supervise/ remind children to wash their hands before eating and after using the toilet.

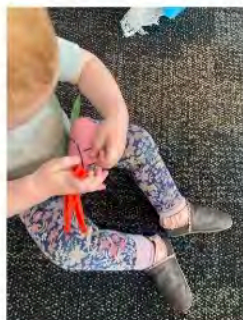
Our SETUP for Success program 'Happy Hearts' has made a great start to 2023.

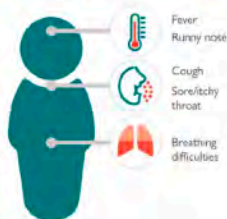


COVID-19 testing for all Tasmanian residents

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
