

Pentecost Sunday (YEAR A) - 28 MAY 2023

FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all GOSPEL ACCLAMATION assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and Alleluia, alleluia! astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them **and kindle in them the fire of your love.** in his own native language? SECOND READING

1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven: for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Dear Parish family,

As Autumn slowly moves on to become Winter and the nights get colder, I look forward each afternoon to getting home and lighting the fire in the presbytery living room. Seeing the flames take hold of the kindling and then the larger logs of wood as they are added to the fireplace provides some comfort in knowing that the evening won't be so cold and uncomfortable as eventually a roaring fire will provide all the warmth the house needs!

Perhaps the disciples huddled together felt the same encouragement upon seeing the tongues of fire descend on each other as they were filled with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, warming their hearts and giving life to their mission to go out to the ends of the earth as instructed by Jesus.

I remember as a child thinking this scene, pictured in a variety of styles, resembled a birthday cake with many candles burning above it. This is fitting when you think about it, as Pentecost is often described as the "birthday of the church" – the coming of the Holy Spirit inaugurates the churches mission of evangelization, drawing people into relationship with Jesus Christ, through Baptism.

Perhaps a helpful reflection for us – disciples of Jesus Christ in our time and place – is to feel the warmth of our home fires burning within our hearts. As the heat from fire penetrates our bodies to warm it up and bring us back to life, so the Holy Spirit inflames us with the love of God and the desire to share this love with the whole world.

May we all be open this week to the gift of the Holy Spirit and be reassured of the communion we share with God, with one another, and all creation.
