Master Planning.....

In 2017 we at Sacred Heart underwent a significant investigation of our outdoor environment. We surveyed our school community, staff, students and parents to inform our thinking and develop a Master Plan. Play Street was employed to design new playspaces informed by the opinions of our school community.

In the past 6 years we have achieved the following

- Established a playspace which includes gardens and landscaping between Kinder and Grade 5. The playspace cost in excess of \$350,000. Our P and F contributed \$90,000. Our school contributed the remainder.
- Built an all weather court. The space cost our school approximately \$40,000. Our P and F contributed \$10,000. Our school funded \$30,000.
- Beautified the main entrance to our school with new paving and landscaping.
- Almost completed 'Sacred Heart Avenue', outside the Music Block, which includes new play equipment and improved pathways and landscaping. This project has cost in excess of \$650,000. Our school has contributed \$300,000, our P and F \$15,000 and the remainder from a grant.
- Redeveloped our oval, including redesigning and replacing our drainage system and re turfed the oval.
- Several minor landscaping projects in Kinder, Loose Parts play and in many other areas around our school.

We share this information as a way to remind our community that we are continually looking at ways to improve, both indoors and outdoors, and with this we need the continued support of our community by way of contributing to fundraisers, helping where possible, staying actively involved by reading our communications and contributing ideas.

This week representatives from the Board, P and F and some staff members along with 12 students from Grades 3-6 worked with Vision Well to share thinking, ideas and develop a plan for the future of our outdoor and indoor facilities. All Tasmanian Catholic Schools are undergoing this process.

EMOTIONAL WELLNESS

If I held a glass of water for a little while, it wouldn't feel heavy. Perhaps I could hold it for a few hours, without feeling like it was too much. But if I continued to hold a glass of water for days, weeks, months or even years, it would eventually become so heavy that it would be impossible to hold.

The emotions we hold within us can be compared to holding a glass of water. Our glass gets filled up day by day by little events and triggers that 'drip' into it; running late, having a lot to get done, friendship fires, changes of plans.

While we navigate each trigger, emotionally it is like the filling of our glass and if we don't use strategies to empty our glass, it will eventually overflow. Likewise if we hold on to our glass for too long, it will become impossible to continue carrying.

At Sacred Heart, we are constantly exploring strategies and tools that can support our emotional wellness. Understanding the power of these little habits, teaches us the importance of emptying our glass and putting it down every now and then.

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



WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form <u>www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children</u>
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
