Celebrating Nano Nagle.....

Today we celebrate Green Day at Sacred Heart. Green Day is an opportunity to honour Nano Nagle and give thanks for all she has done.

Nano Nagle was born into a wealthy family in Ireland, in 1718. At this time the leaders didn't like Catholics and they made it illegal for Catholic children to go to school. Fortunately, Nano and her sister came from a wealthy family that was able to smuggle them to Paris for a full Catholic education.

When Nano Nagle came back from her school, she saw how poor the Catholic people and children of Ireland were. She opened a secret school to teach them, hoping that this would help them be able to live better lives. Nano Nagle was always helping. Her motto of 'Not words, but deeds' describes how she lived her life. By seeing something and doing it. By helping, educating, praying and sharing God's word. Other ladies came to help Nano Nagle. They too lived out her motto and went all around the world, helping and teaching children. These ladies who did God's work were the Presentation Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Presentation Sisters even came to Launceston and began teaching girls here at Sacred Heart in 1873.

Sacred Heart Catholic School is indebted to these remarkable women who had the foresight and ongoing commitment to educate children in our Catholic faith with the intent of accepting children regardless of their needs and background.

It is our responsibility, as the current custodians of SHS, to continue their mission. Our current cohort of 465 children is made up from 300 families. We are blessed by the individualism and uniqueness of each and every child. We know that each one of these children will behave in different ways at different times. It is our responsibility to challenge ourselves to continue to look for ways we can support children as they grow closer to being the person that Jesus intended them to be. At times you may hear children described in a negative light, remember it is our responsibility to look for the good in each child.

Let us all take the time to give thanks to the Presentation Sisters for establishing the community we are all the beneficiaries of.

Building Update

In 2017 our school developed a Sacred Heart Master Plan for our outdoor playgrounds. We consulted widely with a parent, staff and student community. We used the expertise of PlayStreet to develop the Master Plan.

The first phase of the Master Plan was the development of the playground and landscaping between Kindergarten and our current Grade 5 Block (Block G).

Phase 2 was the development of the all weather court.

Phase 3 is due for completion in the Term 3 holidays.

Phase 3 of our project includes

- A re-developed playspace below the Block C
- Addressing the 'aging' pathways and walkways around Block B and C
- Landscaping the spaces around Block C and below

Our building and playground works are continuing to make steady progress. The inground trampolines and slide have now been installed, more than half of the pathways have been completed and the musical instruments were installed this week. The project is now due for completion at the end of the first week of the holidays.

A few changes with spaces....

- The Music Room will takeover the Grade 5 Classrooms (upstairs) in Block C
- Downstairs in Block C will become The Hub
- Grade 5 will stay in Block G. We will be working on improving the space in the Christmas break
- Before and After School Care will be working out of the Old Hall

We look forward to opening these spaces for our children to enjoy in Term 4.

COVID Update:

Public Health recently raised the COVID-19 risk level to moderate.

When the COVID-19 risk level in Tasmania is moderate it means cases of COVID-19 per day are increasing which indicates that the virus is circulating widely in our communities.

TCEO offices and schools continue to adhere to the settings in our COVID-19 Safety Plan . At a personal level Public Health advise:

- Be up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines (including boosters) and annual flu vaccination
- Stay home and get tested for COVID-19 if you have any cold or flu-like symptoms, no matter how mild
- If you test positive by RAT, register your result
- Stay at home while you still have symptoms
- Wear a mask in indoor public places for 7 days after your positive test
- If you have COVID-19 or cold or flu-like symptoms do not visit high risk settings or people at higher risk from respiratory illness for at least 7 days
- If you have been in close contact with a person who tests positive to COVID-19 be alert for symptoms
- Cover coughs and sneezes and keep your hands clean by washing with soap and water, or by using alcohol-based hand sanitiser
- Public Health recommends wearing a face mask in crowded indoor spaces, on Public Transport, and when visiting people who may be at risk of severe illness.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you will not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working with children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
