GOSPEL

Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

Dear Parish Family Some thoughts to ponder for this week,

This second Sunday of Lent we are presented with the vision of Christ glorified, given to these Apostles on Mt Tabor, this surely was a very special privilege and it was one they did not forget easily. "We saw His glory," John says in his gospel, written over sixty years later. In his epistles John once again refers to this privilege. Peter, writing from Rome to the churches in Asia Minor about thirty years later, mentions this outstanding experience: as he says, "for we are not following fictitious tales when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we have been eye witnesses of His majesty. For He received from God honour and glory, when from out of that majestic glory a



voice came down to him saying: "this is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." And this voice we ourselves heard, borne from heaven when we were with him on the holy mountain." (2 Peter 1:16-18).

It is for a good reason that the Church presents to us the story of the Transfiguration during this season of Lent, this season of self-discipline, where we are invited to go into the secret places of our heart, where we let go and let God take the lead in our life. Christ in his own Transfiguration seems to remind us that sufferings and trials leads us to a glorious and unending future life for us.
