INSIGHT INTO

LEARNING

Catholic Education Tasmania (CET) Insight Project.

This year, many Schools and Colleges in Tasmania continue with, or formally move into, Catholic Education Tasmania's Insight Project, focusing on high levels of learning for our students. The Insight project focuses on improving the three key foundations of teaching and learning:

- 1 A comprehensive, knowledge rich curriculum: that supports student's growth in learning, knowing and remembering every day;
- 2 Cognitive Science (the Science of Learning): Developing our understanding about how people learn; to overcome the limits of working memory in order to maximise student learning and to build long-term memory in all key subjects; and
- 3 High Impact Pedagogy: Regular and intensive coaching to assist our educators in actively applying the science of learning as we design highly efficient and effective teaching and learning methods in the classroom.

The TCSPC will be arranging for a subject matter expert from Catholic Education Tasmania to present on INSIGHT via an on-line information session or sessions. This/these will be held during Term 2 or Term 3 of this year. More information will be provided in due course

Riverbend Park

This new all-abilities park has transformed a former industrial precinct into a major new recreational area for Launceston, funded by the City of Launceston and the State and Federal Governments.

Riverbend Park is divided into four zones: The River Play area, Gorge Play area, Wild Core area, and Urban Plaza.



Each zone contains a range of play equipment and experiences, including swings, diggers, sand pits, a wheelchair carousel, a water play area, musical instruments, outdoor table tennis, see-saws and a full size sports court.

The park's largest attractions are undoubtedly the Sky Walk and the 'confluence net', two of the largest pieces of play equipment in Australia.

It also boasts barbecue facilities, public toilets, a giant mural, and a fenced toddler play area.
