In a few short days we will say farewell to our Grade 6 students, most having spent the last 8 years at S.H.C.S. We will also say farewell to some families, as their youngest child leaves S.H.C.S. Some of our families are ending the living tradition with SHCS of many years, sometimes decades and often generations. During their time at SHCS they have made an imprint on our community and we hope that the community will leave an imprint on them.

At the exact same time some are beginning a tradition with SHCS that could last years, decades and possibly generations. In all of this change, one thing remains constant: the school community. The tradition and connection to community is a powerful thing!

I take great pride in being connected to S.H.C.S., having attended St. Patrick's Junior School (our current Kinder and Grade 5). I like seeing families continue the traditions of attending this school! I like the fact that my children play for Saints Basketball Club, a club that I played for and that their grandma, helped set up, as a founding committee member for students at this school. I love the fact my children experience connections and commitment to something bigger than the individual. That they are part of the continuing tradition of something bigger than them. I am sure many families could name other examples where this same importance of tradition and connecting to community applies for you.

In an increasingly secular society it is so easy to dismiss tradition as something just in the past. It is much more popular to just do what suits us, separate to the group or team, to opt out when things can get difficult. In a world increasingly reluctant to take and accept responsibility of actions as a general rule, our children more than ever need to learn about commitment, perseverance and persistence. There is growing evidence that young people are less likely to be involved in more at risk behaviours as young adults when they have the following 4 ingredients:

- 1. High levels of responsibility
- 2. High Expectations placed on them
- Resilience
- 4. Tradition- connection with family, school or equivalent.

#### From the Principal:

People will come and go from organisations, sporting teams, schools and communities generally. Hard as it is to accept, within days, weeks or months, it won't matter! There will be sadness however soon it will be a memory! This can be hard to swallow to recognise you are special but not that special! As a Principal I must operate and lead in a way that makes my presence increasingly less critical. That the community, team or school has to be stronger than the individual going forward.

As parents our job is to 'teach' our children. Not the academics but the intangibles of life! Loyalty, friendship, commitment, resilience and perseverance, to name a few. It is hard when our children want to do certain things but we know as parents the right thing to do is to continue with what is already in place! It is hard as a parent to make the right decision not the populist one!

I want to take this opportunity for those families and students leaving to thank you for choosing our school community. No doubt there were times that were positive, happy and fantastic. No doubt there were also difficult times! No doubt the school got it wrong at times, no doubt as parents you got it wrong too!

I want to thank you for leaving an imprint on our school, for sticking with us when it could have been easier to leave, teaching your children the value of persistence, loyalty and commitment. I hope that when you look back on your time here that you are also proud of shortly being an old collegian of S.H.C.S. I hope that you are proud to name the Primary School you attended and that we have helped as best we could in shaping your life from 4-12 years of age, in a way that this influences your future directions for a greater good from this point on! I swam against teams from Fiji, China, Macau, India, Pakistan, Cambodia and New Zealand. The first day I did two team relay events the first was a 4x50 Medley relay and the second was the 4x100 Freestyle relay our team swam really well and finished second in our heats. In the afternoon, we had our official games Opening Ceremony. We got to meet everybody competing in the Pacific School Games (including people from other sports) We gathered at the Adelaide Showgrounds with around 4000 other kids. Team Tasmania sat next to China so I managed to get a selfie with my new Chinese friends! My individual races were, 100m Freestyle, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke and 200m Breaststroke. The competition was incredibly tough but I was really proud that I got Personal Bests in all my events. A highlight was swimming the 50m Free in 29.48 seconds and taking 13 seconds off my 200m Breaststroke race. We had an excursion day and got to go to The Adelaide Zoo with all the other 12/13 year old competitors, it was fantastic. The Pacific School Games was an amazing experience. I met lots of great kids from other states and countries. I had a lot of fun and it was a terrific opportunity for which I am really grateful.

- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity


